Q1-2018 vs. Q1-2017

The Group registered revenue of RM8.3 million and loss after tax of RM1.1 million for the current quarter ("Q1 2018") compared to revenue of RM7.9 million and loss after tax of RM0.2 million of the corresponding quarter of previous year ("Q1 2017"). The higher revenue was mainly due to higher demand for software platform products and value added services in the Mobile Solutions segment. Higher loss after tax was mainly due expenditure on the media advertising and campaign for various region. Expenditure incurred to rebuild sales team for various region further affected the performance of the Group for the current quarter.

The Mobile Solutions segment recorded revenue of RM8.1 million for Q1 2018, representing an increase of RM1.4 million or 22% compared to Q1 2017 due to higher demand for software platform products and value added services from various region. Hence, the Mobile Solutions segment registered a profit before tax of RM1.5 million for Q1 2018 as compared to a profit before tax of RM0.4 million in Q1 2017.

The Trading & Distribution segment recorded a decrease in revenue for the current quarter mainly due to lower sales volume and intense pricing competition resulting in lower average net selling prices. Higher expenditure on the media advertising and campaign further affected the performance of the Group for the current quarter. Hence, the Trading & Distribution segment registered a loss before tax of RM2.1 million for the current quarter compared to a loss before of RM0.4 million in the corresponding quarter of previous year.

Q1-2018 vs. Q4-2017

The Group registered revenue of RM8.3 million and loss after tax of RM1.1 million for the Q1 2018 as compared to revenue of RM12.5 million and loss after tax of RM3.9 million of the previous quarter ended 30 June 2017 ("Q4 2017"). The decrease in revenue was due to lower order fulfilment in Trading & Distribution segment and intense pricing competition resulting in lower average net selling prices. Lower loss after tax was mainly due to non-recurring expense incurred on provision of doubtful debt and inventories written down in the Q4 2017.

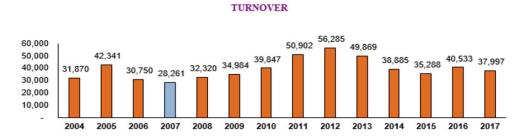
The Mobile Solutions segment recorded revenue of RM8.1 million for Q1 2018, representing a decrease of RM1.3 million or 14% compared to Q4 2017 due to lower demand for Value Added Services ("VAS") from certain region. Despite the lower revenue, the Mobile Solutions segment registered a profit before tax of RM1.51 million for Q1 2018 as compared to a profit before tax of RM0.03 million in Q4 2017. This was mainly due to non-recurring expense incurred on provision of doubtful debt Q4 2017.

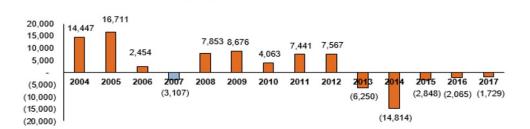
The Trading & Distribution segment recorded a decrease in revenue for Q1 2018 mainly due to lower sales volume and intense pricing competition resulting in lower average net selling prices. Despite the lower revenue, the Trading & Distribution segment registered a loss before tax of RM2.1 million for Q1 2018 compared to a loss before of RM4.9 million in Q4 2017. This was mainly due non-recurring expense incurred on provision of doubtful debt and inventories written down in Q4 2017.

12. Commentary on Prospects

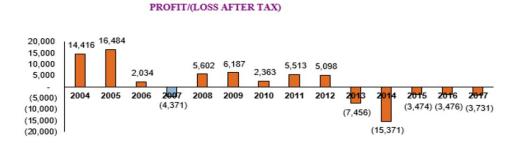
An overview of our past performances

From 2004 to 2012, M3 Tech had been profitable, with 2007 being the only loss-making year. Over the same period, M3 Tech had distributed dividends totaling in excess of RM20 million to its shareholders.

Beginning 2013 began a difficult time for M3 Tech, due to the decline Value Added Service & GPS device distribution revenue, whereupon M3 Tech immediately embarked on a group restructuring exercise to stem the losses. At the same time, investments were made in R&D in multiple areas to prepare the future product stream.

An overview of our present business development

M3 Tech has since completed 4 software platform products, of which revenue is based on the SaaS ("Software as a Service") business model as follows:

i3AppsBuilder - Mobile Software (App) Generators

i3Display - Content Management & Broadcast System for display devices

i3TeamWorks - Business Management Software

i3Trackers - Platform Software for GPS Tracking Devices

All the above software is actively marketed and in use right now, with positive responses to all. As a matter of fact, i3AppsBuilder recently received the 2017 APICTA Award for Best Application & Infrastructure Tools, whereas i3Trackers & i3TeamWorks were shortlisted as finalists in their respective fields

I3AppsBuilder is a mobile application ("app") generator for any business that wishes to have their dedicated and customized mobile app. Its design allows anyone to create and build apps without any programming knowledge. As with any other SaaS product, i3AppsBuilder is licensed and charged on a yearly basis.

In addition, our recently launched i3SOS ("Self Ordering System" for F&B outlets) is a testament to the sophisticated and highly functional mobile application that can be built easily using the i3AppsBuilder platform. i3AppsBuilder can also integrate with i3Display.

i3Display is designed to control and manage content that is displayed on ANY type of display device, encompassing anything from large outdoor LED devices down to the smallest indoor screens and monitors. Its rich features are suitable for deployment in all types of business, such as in shopping malls, showrooms, airports, or for use at events (weddings, conventions, etc.).

Support for touch-screen interactivity allows displays to serve as self-help kiosks, allowing the devices to serve as fast-food ordering stations, airport check-in stations, photo kiosks, information kiosks, and many more. i3Display is licensed and charged on a yearly basis.

i3TeamWorks is built for businesses to manage their business. This software is suitable for any size of company, with employee numbers ranging from single digits to the thousands, it embodies all aspects of business management. There are myriad of functions and we have classified them into 3 main categories: Work Culture, Office Culture, and Sales Culture.

Each category contains modules designed to improve efficiency, transparency, accountability, and most importantly, reduce the negative impact arising from forgotten tasks, missed deadlines, and generally inefficient practices. Software is licensed and charged on a per user and per year basis

I3Trackers is a GPS device management platform built to support multi-protocol servers and mobile applications, which means it can handle almost any device from any manufacturer. Data from GPS devices is easily translated into usable information, and two-way capability is also possible. Mobile apps are able to send signals to the devices, enabling specific functions such as engine cut-off to automobiles. This initiative amalgamates M3 Tech's core competence in GPS and device programming, taking us into the IoT ("Internet of Things") business models of the future. Software is licensed on per device and charged per year basis.

Commercially, after our corporate exercise on Rights Issue of shares in end-2016, and since the start of this current financial year ending 30 June 2018, the following has been undertaken by the Company:

- 1. Rebuild Sales Team in Malaysia, Indonesia, Thailand, Hong Kong, and China to focus on i3Display & i3TeamWorks' sales & marketing.
- 2. Carry on Media Advertising & Campaign for various region
- 3. Participate in International Exhibitions (Shanghai, Shenzhen, and Dubai)

Since then, M3 Tech has clocked in quite impressive results in terms of paying customers to our SaaS platforms. We now have close to 2,500 licenses sold for i3Display, with another 2,000 license for i3TeamWorks.

Malaysia is the longest-running market for i3Display and many prominent brands have adopted i3Display devices for their events. There are also many permanent installations of i3Display devices, such as in showrooms, airports, malls, and other public places.

At the same time, i3Display also has customers in Thailand, Moscow, Mexico, Taiwan, Hong Kong, and China. We have started international distribution headquartered in Hong Kong, with Chinese display device manufacturers bundling i3Display software with their hardware, resulting in many additional license sales.

i3TeamWorks' customers are also extremely diverse in terms of both industry and size, with the latter comprising SMEs and banks to listed companies.

This i3Tracker model is to work with OEMs, leveraging the marketing reach of existing businesses instead of spending unnecessary time and effort for mediocre results. We currently have agreements with telcos, both locally and in Indonesia, to supply GPS hardware and software.

An overview of our future prospects

Malaysia & South East Asia

It is imperative to understand that, not only do we now have 4 powerful core platforms that are quickly gaining acceptance on an international basis, but also these platforms are evergreen technologies with infinite lifespans. They all cater to the new business norms of having your own apps, displays, and using technology to manage your workforce, bringing these tools to everyone, and not just large corporations with deep pockets.

M3 Tech will also magnify the sales revenue by rebuilding its overseas operations to their fullest potential. Distributors and resellers have already been appointed, and will continue to be recruited to enhance sales globally. We will also continue to work closely with Chinese device manufacturers so that we are able to tap into their extensive marketing networks.

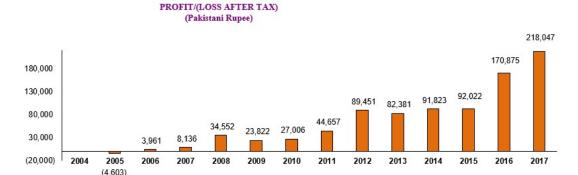
With the above in mind, our Hong Kong operation will be given the exclusive rights to market i3Display and i3TeamWorks worldwide, as Hong Kong historically has, and continues to be, a highly prominent global marketplace.

Pakistan & Middle East

Since 2005, M3Tech has invested to start the Pakistan operation with AKD Venture Fund Limited, and Pakistan financial result has been impressive. Graph below sets our Pakistan's performance since 2005 till to date:-

As such, prospects continue to be strong, provided that the economy in general remains robust. The Board is cautiously optimistic on the Group's performance.

To summarize, M3 Group now owns 4 formidable software products which are gaining traction in markets around the world. All of these products are based on a SaaS business model (i.e. yearly subscription), and we have had a positive response since July.

M3 has long completed the development phases of the above products, as well as several revisions. They have all reached a level of sophisticated maturity, are in the marketing phase, and already has active users across the world. Sales momentum is expected to continue to build, with more users signing onto i3Display & i3TeamWorks in the months to come.

Close collaboration with digital display manufacturers in China have already borne fruit as they continue to bundle and/or resell our software. This makes us optimistic that, barring any unforeseen circumstances, our i3 series of software products will contribute significantly to our future bottom line.
