# PART B - EXPLANATORY NOTES PURSUANT TO APPENDIX 9B OF THE LISTING REQUIREMENTS OF BURSA MALAYSIA SECURITIES BERHAD

#### 13. Review of Performance

#### Current Quarter - Group

For the quarter under review, Ygl Group recorded a revenue of RM850,442 which was a decrease of 30.9% as compared to a revenue of RM1,230,656 achieved in the preceding year corresponding quarter ended 31 March 2018. Gross loss for the quarter under review was RM82,712 as compared to gross loss of RM20,773 for the preceding year corresponding quarter. This was due to lower revenue recorded for the guarter under review.

Net loss from operations for the quarter under review was RM437,864 which was a decrease of 7.0% as compared to net loss from operations of RM470,676 in the preceding year corresponding quarter ended 31 March 2018. The net loss from operations for both comparative quarters was due to low revenue recorded amidst fixed direct overheads.

#### Malaysia Segment

For the quarter under review, the Malaysia segment recorded a revenue of RM675,523 which was a decrease of 4.7% as compared to a revenue of RM708,828 achieved in the preceding year corresponding quarter ended 31 March 2018. Loss from operations for the quarter under review was RM288,922 as compared to loss from operations of RM462,798 for the preceding year corresponding quarter ended 31 March 2018. This was due to lower direct costs charged out for certain projects and provisions made during the quarter under review as compared to preceding year corresponding quarter.

#### Asia Pacific Segment

For the quarter under review, the Asia Pacific segment recorded a revenue of RM174,919 which was a decrease of 66.5% as compared to a revenue of RM521,828 achieved in the preceding year corresponding quarter ended 31 March 2018. Loss from operations for the quarter under review was RM148,942 as compared to loss from operations of RM7,878 for the preceding year corresponding quarter ended 31 March 2018. This was due to lower revenue recorded and higher direct costs charged out for certain Hong Kong projects in the current quarter.

## 14. Material Changes in Profit Before Tax Against Preceding Quarter

There was a net loss before tax of RM376,718 for the quarter under review as compared to a net loss before tax of RM717,706 recorded in the preceding year fourth quarter ended 31 December 2018. This was due to higher direct costs incurred for the projects and year end provisions made in the preceding quarter.

## 15. Corporate Proposals

There are no other corporate proposals announced but not completed as at the date of announcement as at 27 May 2019 (the latest practicable date not earlier than 7 days from the date of issue of this financial result).

#### 16. Prospects for 2019

Ygl anticipates more small and medium sized enterprises (SMEs) in Malaysia to adopt technology in 2019 in line with the Malaysian Government's National Policy on Industry 4.0 (Industry4WRD) which offers assistance in the forms of grants and low interest loans for investment in technology such as manufacturing enterprise software, Business Analytics, Internet of Things (IoTs) and Robotics.

This initiative is in line with Ygl expertise and products offerings such as Ygl e-Manufacturing software, the business analytics tools and internet portal products.

- b) To accept reasonable level of price risk and credit risk that commensurate with the expected returns of the underlying operations and activities; and
- c) To minimize liquidity risk by proper cash flow planning, management and control.

The Group's risk management policies include:

- a) Credit controls which include evaluation, acceptance, monitoring and feedback to ensure reasonable credit worthy customers are accepted; and
- b) Money market instruments, short term deposits and bank overdrafts to manage liquidity

The Group does not have a formal policy on future or exchange contracts or hedge activities as foreign currency transactions are dealt directly by the respective overseas subsidiary companies.

There have been no significant changes on the Group's exposure to financial risks from the previous year. Neither have there been any changes to the Group's risk management objectives and policies from the previous year.
