NOTES TO THE INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE SECOND QUARTER ENDED 30 JUNE 2024

PART A - EXPLANATORY NOTES IN COMPLIANCE WITH MALAYSIAN FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS ("MFRS") 134, INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORTING

A1. BASIS OF PREPARATION

The interim financial report of SPRING ART HOLDINGS BERHAD ("SPRING" or "the Company") and its subsidiaries ("the Group") are unaudited and have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of Malaysian Financial Reporting Standards ("MFRS") No. 134: Interim Financial Reporting and Rule 9.22 of Listing Requirements.

This interim financial report should be read in conjunction with the Group's annual audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2023 and the accompanying notes attached to this interim financial report.

A2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant accounting policies and methods of computation adopted by the Group in this interim financial report are consistent with those adopted as disclosed in the Group's annual audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2023.

Adoption of new or revised MFRSs

The Group and the Company have applied the following standards, amendments to published standards and IC Interpretation approved by Malaysian Accounting Standards Board ("MASB") for the first time for the financial year beginning on 1 January 2024:

A3. AUDITORS' REPORT

The audited financial statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2023 was not subject to any qualification.

A4. SEASONAL OR CYCLICAL FACTORS

Our operations are not significantly affected by seasonal or cyclical patterns as our furniture products are exported to several regions globally, where the differing sales and promotion period of furniture sales in different regions allow us to benefit from consistent sales throughout the year.

There were no extraordinary and exceptional items of unusual nature affecting assets, liabilities, equity, net income, or cash flows during the current financial quarter under review.

The Group recorded revenue of RM14.86 million for the current financial quarter ended 30 June 2024 ("Q2 2024"), an increase of 30.9% as compare to the preceding year corresponding quarter ended 30 June 2023 ("Q2 2023").

The increase of revenue was mainly because of higher demand from the Middle East driven by strong consumer spending.

The Group's PBT increased by 426.4% from PBT of RM0.48 million in Q2 2023 to RM2.55 million in Q2 2024. The increase in profit before tax was mainly due to better production efficiency and the strengthening of the US dollar against the Malaysian ringgit.

The Group recorded revenue of RM14.86 million in Q2 2024 as compared to RM14.79 million recorded in the preceding quarter ended 31 March 2024 ("Q1 2024"), it was an increase of RM0.07 million during current financial quarter.

The increase of revenue was due to the higher demand for living furniture in Q2 2024 but overall sales were considered average compared to Q1 2024. The shorter working period due to Hari Raya celebrations also limited sales growth. Despite the modest rise in revenue, PBT decreased, primarily due to higher operating costs.

B3. PROSPECT AND OUTLOOK FOR THE CURRENT FINANCIAL YEAR

The global economy is expected to slow down as inflation control efforts take effect, impacting business activities and creating ongoing difficulties in the export market. In response, our Group will remain focused on our core competencies, actively seek out new opportunities, and implement cost-cutting measures wherever possible. We are prepared to take swift action to mitigate the financial impact.

We also expect the complete of Factory C in Q4 2024, pending the receipt of the Certificate of Completion and Compliance (CCC). We received the Certificate of Practical Completion (CPC) on 28 March 2023. Although there has been a delay, we are optimistic that once Factory C becomes operational, it will improve our prospects by increasing production capacity and better meet customers' needs.

Our Group is dedicated to making prudent decisions to strengthen our business. We will collaborate closely with our customers to streamline orders, manage costs, expand our customer base, and utilize our workforce efficiently. The Board will continue to closely monitor the Group's performance. While we anticipate challenges in the current financial year ending on 31 December 2024, our primary goal is to achieve positive results.
