While the Group's revenue for the current financial period only increased by 21.53% as compared to the corresponding financial period, the Group's PBT increased by 26.43%. The increase in PBT was mainly due to:

- (i) the increase in revenue as elaborated above;
- (i) effective marketing effort from ongoing promotions through online platforms; and
- (ii) better control of operating costs drawing from the experience gained from multiple movement control lockdowns since March 2020.

The Group's revenue decreased from RM28.72 million to RM28.41 million, which was a slight decrease of 1.06%.

The group's PBT decreased by RM0.77 million mainly due to an increase in staff costs, as an additional performance bonus was given out to staff.

B3. Commentary on prospects

With the easing of SOPs and relaxed restrictions, the performance of some branches of the Group has improved, with some returning to pre-COVID-19 levels.

Meanwhile, the resurgence of COVID-19 infections, inflationary pressure due to rising food and energy prices, and disrupted supply chains following the Russia-Ukraine war remain threats to both the local and global economy.

Nonetheless, the Group will continue to monitor its operational costs and seek strategic locations to set up more ambulatory care centers/satellite clinics to support its growth.

Accordingly, the Board of Directors is cautiously optimistic that the Group's prospects for the financial year ending on 31 December 2023 will remain favorable.
