#### A1. BASIS OF PREPARATION

The interim combined financial statements as contained in this interim financial report are unaudited and have been prepared under the historical cost convention method unless otherwise stated. Any discrepancies in the tables between the amounts listed and the totals in this interim report are due to rounding.

These unaudited interim combined financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of MFRS 134: *Interim Financial Reporting* issued by the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board ("**MASB**") and Part (c), Rule 6.12 and Appendix 6A of the LEAP Market Listing Requirements issued by Bursa Securities.

These unaudited interim combined financial statements should be read in conjunction with the audited combined financial statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2019 and the accompanying explanatory notes attached to this interim financial report. The explanatory notes contained herein provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the financial year ended 31 December 2019.

#### A2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The auditors' report on the Group's most recent annual audited combined financial statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2019 were not subject to any qualification.

#### A4. SEASONALITY OR CYCLICALITY OF OPERATION

Generally, our Group's business is not subject to any significant cyclical or seasonal trend.

#### A5. UNUSUAL ITEMS

Save for certain short-term interruption to the Group's operations due to the movement control orders enforced by the Government to curb the COVID-19 pandemic, there were no unusual items affecting the assets, liabilities, equity, net income or cash flows of the Group during the financial period under review.

#### A6. MATERIAL CHANGES IN ESTIMATES

There were no significant changes in estimates of amounts reported in prior financial years that have a material impact on the financial period under review.

#### A7. DEBTS AND EQUITY SECURITIES

There was no issuance, cancellation, repurchase, resale and repayment of debts and equity securities during the financial period under review, save as disclosed below:

- (i) To facilitate the proposed listing of our Company, the Company had, on 8 August 2020, entered into a share sale agreement with Jishan Capital Sdn. Bhd., Ang Chee Beng, Hor Choun Yeen, Khor Chew Wan and Cheah Teik Hee (collectively, "Vendors") to acquire the entire issued share capital of Jishan Pack Sdn. Bhd. ("Jishan Pack"); for an aggregate purchase consideration of RM24,708,000 satisfied via the issuance of 205,900,000 new ordinary shares in the Company to the Vendors at an issue price of RM0.12 per ordinary share. The acquisition was completed on 4 September 2020.
- (ii) On 24 September 2020, the Company allotted 29,251,000 new ordinary shares to a list of 45 investors who made a private offer to subscribe for new ordinary shares in Jishan Sdn. Bhd. at the subscription price of RM0.18 per ordinary share. The details of the 45 investors are elaborated in the Information Memorandum dated 11 December 2020 issued by the Company ("Information Memorandum").

#### A8. DIVIDEND PAID

On 8 January 2020, Jishan Pack declared an interim single-tier dividend of RM0.10 per ordinary share amounting to RM500,000 in respect of the financial year ended 31 December 2019. The interim dividend was paid on 20 January 2020.

On 30 June 2020, Jishan Pack declared first interim single-tier dividend of RM0.10 per ordinary share amounting to RM500,000 in respect of the financial year ending 31 December 2020. The interim dividend was paid on 10 July 2020.

On 1 September 2020, Jishan Pack declared second interim single-tier dividend of RM0.10 per ordinary share amounting to RM500,000 in respect of the financial year ending 31 December 2020. The interim dividend was paid on 15 December 2020.

### A9. MATERIAL EVENTS SUBSEQUENT TO THE END OF THE FINANCIAL PERIOD

On 8 February 2021, the Company completed the listing and quotation of its entire issued share capital of RM29,973,182 comprising 235,151,002 ordinary shares on the LEAP Market.

Save as disclosed above, there were no material events subsequent to the end of the financial period under review that have not been reflected in this interim financial report.

#### A10. CHANGES IN THE COMPOSITION OF THE GROUP

Save as disclosed in Note A7 above and as elaborated in Section 3.1 of the Information Memorandum, there were no changes in the composition of the Group for the 6-months financial period ended ("FPE") 31 December 2020.

# SECTION B - ADDITIONAL INFORMATION REQUIRED BY THE LEAP MARKET LISTING REQUIREMENTS OF BURSA SECURITIES

#### **B1. ANALYSIS OF PERFORMANCE**

#### Revenue

For the 6-months period ended 31 December 2020 ("**2HFY20**"), our Group's revenue increased by approximately RM9.92 million or 33.80% to RM39.27 million as compared to total revenue of RM29.35 million for the corresponding period in the preceding year.

For the financial year ended 31 December 2020 ("FYE 2020"), our Group's revenue increased by approximately RM16.09 million or 28.66% to RM72.23 million (FYE 2019: RM56.14 million).

Our Group recorded improved sales performance for both Paper and Plastic Packaging Products, primarily attributable to increased orders received during the financial period under review, particularly from our existing major customers in the electronics, food and medical products industries; in line with the growing demands from their consumers.

#### **Gross profit ("GP")**

Backed by the revenue growth, our Group's GP increased by approximately RM2.15 million or 28.44% to RM9.71 million for 2HFY20 (6-months period ended 31 December 2019: RM7.56 million) and by approximately RM5.33 million or 41.29% to RM18.24 million for the FYE 2020 (FYE 2019: RM12.91 million) respectively.

In line with our improved profit before tax backed primarily by our revenue growth, our Group's overall tax expenses increased by approximately RM0.47 million or 293.75% and RM0.69 million or 181.58% respectively for the 2HFY2020 and the FYE 2020; representing an effective tax rate of 11.37% and 10.88% respectively for the 2HFY2020 and the FYE 2020.

A lower effective tax rate was recorded for the 2HFY2020 and the FYE 2020, as compared to the statutory tax rate applicable in Malaysia, primarily due to utilisation of unused reinvestment allowance brought forward from prior year resulting in lower chargeable income for tax purposes.

#### Profit after tax ("PAT")

For the 2HFY20, our Group's PAT increased by approximately RM1.11 million or 28.98% to RM4.94 million (6-months period ended 31 December 2019: RM3.83 million); whilst for the FYE 2020, our Group's PAT increased by approximately RM3.96 million or 81.99% to RM8.79 million (FYE 2019: RM4.83 million).

The improved PAT performance was primarily attributable to improved GP backed by our revenue growth during the financial period under review, as explained above.

#### **B2. PROSPECTS**

Paper and Plastic Packaging Products industries in Malaysia are mature and stable industries. Moving forward, the industry size of the Paper Packaging Products industry is forecasted to grow at compounded annual growth rate ("CAGR") of 5.2% between 2020 and 2022, to reach RM5.2 billion in 2022; whilst industry size of the Plastic Packaging Products industry is forecasted to grow at CAGR of 7.9% between 2020 and 2022, to reach RM6.4 billion in 2022.

Our Group's Paper and Plastic Packaging Products are supplied to various industries, particularly the electronics, food and medical products industries. As such, our future growth is also driven by the favourable development and growth of these end-user industries. Moving forward these end-user industries are forecasted to continue growing at the following encouraging rate:

- Electrical and electronics industry forecast CAGR of 3.0% between 2020 and 2022, to reach RM87.2 billion industry size in 2022
- Food industry forecast CAGR of 2.4% between 2020 and 2022, to reach 10.6 million tonnes industry size in 2022
- Medical products industry forecast CAGR of 10.5% between 2020 and 2022, to reach RM11.6 billion industry size in 2022

Our Board is of the view that our Group is well-positioned to capture future growth opportunities for the industry that we operate in, by leveraging on our Group's competitive strengths. Barring any unforeseen circumstances, our Board is cautiously optimistic that our Group's performance will remain stable and encouraging for the financial year ending 31 December 2021.
