1. Basis of preparation

The condensed consolidated interim financial statements are unaudited and have been prepared in accordance with Malaysian Financial Reporting Standard ("MFRS") 134, "Interim Financial Reporting" and paragraph 9.22 and Appendix 9B of the Main Market Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad ("Bursa Malaysia"), and should be read in conjunction with the Group's audited financial statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2015, which were prepared in accordance with the MFRS.

The explanatory notes attached to the interim financial statements provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to gain an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the financial year ended 31 December 2015.

2. Significant accounting policies

The accounting policies adopted by the Group for the quarterly financial statements are consistent with those adopted in the Group's consolidated audited financial statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2015, except for the adoption of the following amendments/improvements to MFRS:

As at the date of authorisation of these interim financial statements, the Group is still assessing the financial impact and the additional disclosure requirements to the financial statements of the Group from the new MFRSs, amendments/improvements to MFRSs that are issued by MASB but not yet effective in the current year.

3. Status of audit qualification

There was no audit qualification in the annual financial statements for the preceding financial year ended 31 December 2015.

4. Seasonal/cyclical factors

The business operations of the Group are subject to the sales cycle of the insurance business and wealth business.

5. Unusual items

There were no unusual items affecting assets, liabilities, equity, net income or cash flows for the financial period ended 30 September 2016.

6. Change in estimates

In general, the Group's insurance subsidiary, Manulife Insurance Berhad valued its policy liabilities using a prospective actuarial valuation. The expected future liability cash flows are determined using best estimate assumption with the appropriate allowance for provision of risk charge for adverse deviation from expected experience. Valuation assumptions used includes mortality, morbidity, lapse, expense, Participating life fund expected long term yield and Malaysian Government Securities (MGS) risk-free interest rate.

For the current period ended 30 September 2016, the applicable assumption changes resulted in higher actuarial liabilities of RM124.9 million (30 September 2015: higher actuarial liabilities of RM29.9 million), with a corresponding decrease in unallocated surplus for the participating business of RM104.3 million (30 September 2015: decrease in unallocated surplus of RM32.0 million) and decrease in net profit before tax of RM20.6 million (30 September 2015: increase in net profit before tax RM2.1 million).

Other than as disclosed above, there were no changes in the basis used for accounting estimates for the current financial period ended 30 September 2016.

7. Debt and equity securities

There were no issuances, cancellation, repurchases, resale and repayment of debt and equity securities during the current financial period ended 30 September 2016.

8. Dividends

A first and final dividend of 9.0 sen per share, amounting to RM18,213,300 for the financial year ended 31 December 2015, was approved at the Annual General Meeting held on 20 May 2016 and the dividend was paid on 16 June 2016.

No dividend has been declared in respect of the current financial period ended 30 September 2016.

9. Material events subsequent to the end of the financial period

There is no material event subsequent to the end of the financial period under review that has not been reported in the interim financial statements for the current financial period to date.

10. Changes in composition of the Group

There were no significant changes in the composition of the Group for the current financial period to date, other than the completion of the liquidation process of two of its subsidiaries.

11. Contingent liabilities

There are no contingent liabilities as at the date of this report since the date of the last annual statement of financial position.

12. Current financial year prospects

The global market volatility driven by low crude oil price and uncertain political environment in the US are negatively affecting the economy in Malaysia, which consequently putting downward pressure on the insurance and wealth businesses. In addition, the local currency which continues to remain weak and volatile against most major currencies has further dampened investment sentiment among investors.

Group earnings are expected to continue to remain challenging for the rest of the year. Earnings pressure arose mainly from low interest environment, worsening claims experience and high medical costs, as well as channel distribution expansion costs. The movement in MGS yield rates will give rise to volatility in the insurance contract liabilities and earnings of the insurance business. The recent lowering of the MGS yield rate led to reserve strengthening and lowered earnings.

The Group will continue to take a considered approach to optimise the utilisation and allocation of resources along the growth journey towards enhancing our brand and improving customer engagement and experience via multiple distribution channels and digital means.

13. Profit forecast

The Group did not issue any profit forecast during the financial period ended 30 September 2016.

14. Group borrowings

The Group does not have any borrowings as at 30 September 2016.

15. Material litigation

There is no material litigation as at the date of this report and since the date of the last annual statement of financial position.

16. Status of corporate proposal

As at the date of this report, there are no corporate proposals that have been announced but not completed.

17. Significant event

There is no significant event during the financial period to date.

19. Review of performance

The management uses operating revenue as a measure of performance for each operating segment. Operating revenue for each reportable segment consists of gross premiums, investment income and fee income.

Financial Period ended 30 September 2016 vs Financial Period ended 30 September 2015

The Group's operating revenue for the financial period ended 30 September 2016 (Year-to-Date ("YTD") September 2016), recorded an increase of 15.0% or RM108.1 million compared to the corresponding financial period ended 30 September 2015 (YTD September 2015) (2016: RM829.1 million, 2015: RM721.0 million). The Group's profit before tax was however, lower by RM10.0 million as compared to the profit before tax in the corresponding YTD 30 September 2015 (2016: RM26.9 million, 2015: RM36.9 million).

Performance of the respective operating business segments are as follows:

Investment holding – Operating revenue declined RM1.2 million compared to the preceding year's corresponding period (2016: RM10.3 million, 2015: RM11.5 million) largely due to lower investment income from fixed income securities.

Life insurance business – Operating revenue of the life insurance business grew 16.4% or RM109.1 million (2016: RM774.2 million, 2015: RM665.1 million) largely attributable to higher contribution from investment-linked business as compared to YTD September 2015. However, profit before tax was RM9.3 million lower compared to YTD September 2015 (2016: RM31.5 million, 2015: RM40.8 million) mainly due to reserve strengthening as a result of lower MGS yield, higher expenses and worsened claims experience.

Asset management services – Operating revenue was RM0.3 million higher as compared to YTD September 2015 (2016: RM44.6 million, 2015: RM44.3 million). Loss before tax slightly increased by RM0.1 million (2016: RM3.9 million, 2015: RM3.8 million) mainly due to higher staff related expenses.

19. Review of performance (continued)

3rd Quarter 2016 vs 3rd Quarter 2015

The Group's operating revenue for the quarter ended 30 September 2016 decreased by 2.8% or RM7.8 million compared to the corresponding quarter ended 30 September 2015 (2016: RM273.0 million, 2015: RM280.8 million). The Group's profit before tax was RM17.6 million for the current quarter, RM0.8 million lower as compared to the profit before tax in the corresponding quarter ended 30 September 2015 of RM18.4 million.

Performance of the respective operating business segments are as follows:

Investment holding – Operating revenue slipped 8% or RM0.3 million as compared to the preceding year's corresponding quarter (2016: RM3.3 million, 2015: RM3.6 million) due to lower investment income from fixed income securities.

Life insurance business – Operating revenue of the life insurance business decreased by RM8.0 million (2016: RM254.1 million, 2015: RM262.1 million) mainly due to lower contribution from investment-linked business as compared to Q3 2015. Profit before tax was RM0.7 million higher in the current quarter (2016: RM20.2 million, 2015: RM19.5 million) due to higher new business gains.

Asset management services – Operating revenue improved marginally by 4% or RM0.6 million compared to preceding year's corresponding quarter (2016: RM15.6 million, 2015: RM15.0 million). Loss before tax increased by RM1.5 million (2016: RM1.7 million, 2015: RM0.2 million) partly due to adjustment of commission expenses in 2015.

20. Commentary on the quarterly results compared to the results of preceding quarter

The Group recorded higher profit before tax of RM17.6 million for the current quarter under review as compared to the profit before tax of RM7.7 million in the preceding quarter ended 30 June 2016. The increase of RM9.9 million was mainly attributable to higher new business gains compared to the preceding quarter and improved claim experience.

(i) Determination of fair values

The fair values of the Group's financial assets and financial liabilities are determined as follows:

- (i) The carrying amounts of financial assets and financial liabilities, such as loans and receivables, insurance receivables, cash and bank balances, insurance payables and other payables, are reasonable approximations of their fair values due to the relatively short term maturity of these balances;
- (ii) The fair values of quoted equities are based on quoted market prices as at the reporting date;
- (iii) The fair values of Malaysian Government Securities, Government Investment Issues and unquoted corporate debt securities are based on indicative market prices;
- (iv) The fair values of negotiable instruments of deposit are calculated using the discounted cash flow method based on the maturity of the instruments at discount rates representing the average market rates quoted by at least two licensed banks;
- (v) The fair values of investments in mutual funds, unit trust funds and real estate investment trusts are valued based on the net asset values of the underlying funds as at the reporting date; and
- (vi) The fair values of foreign exchange forward contracts are based on valuations provided by the financial institutions making reference to quoted market prices.

(ii) Fair value hierarchy

The Group categorises its fair value measurements according to a three-level hierarchy. The hierarchy prioritises the inputs used by the Group's valuation techniques for determining the fair value of the financial instruments.

A level is assigned to each fair value measurement based on the lowest level input significant to the fair value measurement in its entirety. The three-level hierarchy is defined as follows:

- Level 1 –Fair value measurements that reflect unadjusted, quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities that the Group has the ability to access at the measurement date. Valuations are based on quoted prices reflecting market transactions involving assets or liabilities identical to those being measured.
- Level 2 –Fair value measurements using inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly. These include quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in inactive markets, inputs that are observable that are not prices (such as interest rates, credit risks, etc) and inputs that are derived from or corroborated by observable market data.
- Level 3 –Fair value measurements using significant non market observable inputs. These include valuations for assets and liabilities that are derived using data, some or all of which is not market observable, including assumptions about risk.

In determining the fair value of its financial instruments, the Group uses observable market data, when available, and minimises the use of unobservable inputs to the extent possible when determining fair value.
