16. Performance Review

The Company's revenue of RM4.30 million for the current quarter and RM5.87 million for the current financial year ended 30 June 2013 were higher than last year's corresponding quarter of RM2.20 million and financial year of RM3.70 million. This was mainly due to higher dividend and interest income.

For the current quarter, the Company reported an after-tax loss of RM5.95 million which was lower than corresponding quarter a year ago by RM836,000 despite share of associate's loss of RM5.17 million for the current quarter was higher than the share of RM1.63 million for the quarter a year ago. This was mainly due to:-

- 1) Higher dividend and interest were received during the current quarter.
- 2) The fair value loss of RM8.46 million arising from the revaluation of its long-term investment in securities was lower than the loss of RM8.75 million suffered during last year's corresponding quarter.
- 3) The fair value gain arising from the revaluation of its investment properties of RM3.72 million was higher than the gain of RM1.79 million reported a year ago.

The Company posted an after-tax profit of RM46.68 million for the current financial year ended 30 June 2013 which was a positive turnaround from the loss of RM14.35 million suffered a year ago. This was due to:-

- 1) Higher dividend and interest were received during the current financial year.
- 2) The revaluation of its long-term investment in securities for the current financial year was a fair value gain of RM31.17 million as compared to the fair value loss of RM15.12 million suffered a year ago.
- 3) The fair value gain arising from the revaluation of its investment properties for the current financial year was higher than the gain reported a year ago.
- 4) Share of associate's financial results was a profit of RM7.11 million while last year was a loss of RM3.64 million.

The Company posted a pre-tax loss of RM5.93 million for the current quarter ended 30 June 2013 as compared to the pre-tax profit of RM21.28 million achieved during the immediate preceding quarter despite the Company reported a fair value gain of RM3.72 million arising from the revaluation of its investment properties while there was none in the immediate preceding quarter. This was due to:-

- For the current quarter, the revaluation of its long-term investment in securities resulted in a fair value loss of RM8.46 million while it was a fair value gain of RM17.47 million for the immediate preceding quarter.
- 2) Share of associate's results was a loss of RM5.17 million while it was a profit of RM3.83 million for the immediate preceding quarter.

18. Commentary on Prospects

The Company's results for the next financial year ending 30 June 2014 will be dependent on dividend income receivable from investments, the effect of exchange rate fluctuations and the market valuation of its investments.

The results of the associated company may be affected by the plantation contribution and market valuation of its investments. The plantation is expected to achieve satisfactory levels of profitability, barring unforeseen circumstances.
