A NOTES TO THE QUARTERLY RESULTS

A1. Basis of Preparation

The interim financial report has been prepared in accordance with FRS 134: Interim Financial Reporting and Chapter 9 Appendix 9B of the Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad. The figures for 12 months ended 31 March 2014 have been audited.

The interim financial report should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2013 which are available at http://www.ijm.com. The explanatory notes attached to the interim financial report provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the financial year ended 31 March 2013.

A2. Changes in Accounting Policies

On 19 November 2011, the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board ("MASB") issued a new MASB approved accounting framework, the Malaysian Financial Reporting Standards ("MFRS Framework"). The MFRS Framework is to be applied by all Entities Other Than Private Entities for annual periods beginning on or after 1 January 2012, with the exception of entities that are within the scope of MFRS 141 "Agriculture" and/or IC Interpretation 15 "Agreements for Construction of Real Estate", including their parent, significant investor and venturer (herein called "Transitioning Entities").

Based on the MASB announcement on 7 August 2013, Transitioning Entities will be allowed to defer the adoption of the new MFRS Framework from the previous adoption date of 1 January 2014 to 1 January 2015. Consequently, the adoption of the MFRS Framework by Transitioning Entities will be mandatory for annual periods beginning on or after 1 January 2015.

The Group falls within the scope of Transitioning Entities and accordingly, will adopt the MFRS Framework for the financial year beginning 1 April 2015. For the financial year ending 31 March 2014, the Group will continue to prepare its financial statements using the Financial Reporting Standards framework.

The significant accounting policies applied are consistent with those adopted for the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2013 except for the adoption of the following new standards, amendments to standards and IC interpretations issued by MASB that are mandatory for the Group for the financial year beginning 1 April 2013:

The adoption of the above pronouncements does not result in any significant change to the accounting policies and does not have any material impact on the interim financial information of the Group.

A3. Disclosure of Audit Report Qualification and Status of Matters Raised

The audit report for the financial years ended 31 March 2014 and 31 March 2013 were not subject to any modifications or qualifications.

A4. Seasonality or Cyclicality of Operations

The Group's performance is affected by the oil palms cropping pattern that normally starts in a trough in the first half of a calendar year before rising to a peak in the second half.

A5. Unusual Significant Items

Other than the net foreign exchange losses shown in Note B12, there were no items affecting assets, liabilities, equity, net income, or cash flows that are unusual in nature, size or incidence during the financial year-to-date under review.

A6. Material Changes in Estimates

There were no major changes in estimates that have had a material effect in the current quarter and financial year-to-date.

A7. Debt and Equity Securities

There were no cancellations, repurchases, resale and repayments of debt and equity securities for the current quarter and financial year-to-date except that the paid-up share capital of the Company was increased by RM1,337,806 by way of allotment and issuance of 2,675,612 ordinary shares of RM0.50 each arising from the exercise of the Warrants 2009/2014 of the Company.

A8. Dividend Paid

The liquidation of IJMPIL is part of the Group's corporate restructuring exercise and has no material impact on the Group for the financial year-to-date.

Individual Quarter -- Q4-FY2014 vs Q4-FY2013

For Q4-FY2014, the Group recorded a 39.2% increase in revenue as compared to Q4-FY2013 due to higher sales volume and commodity prices. In addition to lower plantation upkeep costs due to phased activities, profit before tax was higher as a result of the strengthening of the Rupiah against the US Dollar.

The performance by geographical segments are summarised as follows:

- (a) the Malaysian operations recorded higher revenue during the current quarter as a result of higher sales volume and commodity prices. FFB production was lower due to change in cropping pattern. However, profit before tax was higher due to the higher commodity prices and lower plantation upkeep costs due to phased activities; and
- (b) the Indonesian operations recorded higher revenue due to more areas attaining maturity and with the palm oil mill in full operation. Despite the large newly matured area incurring full fixed plantation maintenance and overhead costs against the backdrop of start-up crop yields, a higher profit before tax was achieved. This was due to the strengthening of the Rupiah against the US Dollar resulting in unrealised exchange gains from the US Dollar borrowings.

B1. Review of Performance (cont'd)

Cumulative Period -- Year to-date FY 2014 vs Year to-date FY 2013

The year to-date revenue of the Group was 33.0% higher than that of the preceding year. The increase was due to higher sales volume. The financial performance was however impacted by the unrealised foreign exchange losses, in addition to the lower CPO prices.

The performance by geographical segments are summarised as follows:

- (a) despite FFB production declining by 8% because of the palm stress factor, higher revenue was recorded in the Malaysian operations due to reduction in closing inventory. The decrease in profit before tax was due to the decline in CPO prices and higher plantation costs; and
- (b) whilst the higher revenue recorded in the Indonesian operations was due to a larger area under maturity and the full year's operation of the palm oil mill, the impact of unfavorable foreign exchange rates resulted in a loss during the financial year.

Revenue for the Q4-FY2014 was higher than Q3-FY2014 mainly due to higher commodity prices. With the strengthening of the Rupiah against the US Dollar resulting in unrealised foreign exchange gains, the financial performance improved significantly.

The Malaysian operations recorded higher revenue mainly due to increase in commodity prices. As a result, the profit before tax was higher.

The Indonesian operations recorded improved financial performance due to the strengthening of the Rupiah against the US Dollar in Q4-FY2014.

B3. Prospects for the Coming Financial Year

Despite growing production cost pressures attributable to the significant increase in young mature areas in the Indonesian operations incurring full fixed plantation maintenance and overhead costs set against start-up crop yields, and anticipated uncertainties in respect of CPO prices and foreign exchange rates, the Group expects the profitability level for the coming financial year to be satisfactory on the back of higher crop production from the increasing young mature areas in Indonesia and the sustaining of FFB yields from the Malaysian operations.
