14. Related party transactions

There were no related party transactions during the quarter except for rental of premises amounting to RM115,974 (YTD:RM115,974) paid/payable to Desa Samudra Sdn. Bhd, companies in which a director, Dato' Choo Keng Weng has financial interest. This transaction has been entered into in the normal course of business and has been established in commercial terms.

15. Review of Performance

The revenue for the reported quarter of RM14.9 million is lower than RM28.8 million as recorded for the corresponding quarter of last year. The current quarter has reported a loss before taxation of RM3.9 million as compared to a profit before taxation of RM1.1 million recorded for the corresponding quarter of last year.

The decrease in profit is mainly due to the lower sales volume as a result of the shortage of raw materials.

16. Material Changes in results compared with immediate preceding quarter

The Group's revenue for the reported quarter of RM14.9 million is lower than the RM29.1 million recorded for the immediate preceding quarter.

The Group registered a loss before taxation of RM3.9 million in the current quarter as compared to the profit of RM1.1 million of the immediate preceding quarter. The decrease in profit is mainly due to the decrease in sales as a result of the shortage of raw materials.

17. Current year prospects

The outlook for the timber industry remains challenging for the current year as the market uncertainties still prevail. The Group will continue to implement cost reduction measures and strive to enhance productivity and yield in the manufacturing process so as to remain competitive in the industry.

18. **Profit forecast or profit guarantee**

The disclosure requirements for explanatory notes for the variance of actual profit after tax against profit guarantee/forecast are not applicable as the Group did not issue any profit guarantee/forecast to the public.
