1 Corporate information

George Kent (Malaysia) Berhad is a public limited liability company incorporated and domiciled in Malaysia, and is listed on Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad ("Bursa").

These condensed consolidated interim financial statements were approved by the Board of Directors on 15 December 2020.

2 Basis of preparation

These condensed consolidated interim financial statements are unaudited and had been prepared in compliance with the requirements of Malaysian Financial Reporting Standard ("MFRS") 134: Interim Financial Reporting and paragraph 9.22 of the Listing Requirements of Bursa and should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements of the Group for the financial year ended 31 January 2020.

Adoption of New and Revised Malaysian Financial Reporting Standards

During the current financial year, the Group has adopted all the new and revised Standards and Interpretation issued by the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board ("MASB") that are relevant to their operations and effective for annual periods beginning on or after 1 January 2020 as follows:

- Amendments to MFRS 3: Definition of a Business
- Amendments to MFRS 9, MFRS 139, MFRS 7: Interest Rate Benchmark Reform
- Amendments to MFRS 101, MFRS 108: Definition of Material
- Amendments to References to the Conceptual Framework in MFRS Standards

The adoption of the above Standards and Amendments did not result in significant changes in the accounting policies and have no significant effect on the financial position, results and disclosures in the financial statements of the Group in the period of initial application.

3 Changes in estimates

There were no changes in estimates that have had a material effect in the current interim results.

4 Changes in composition of the Group

There were no significant changes in the composition of the Group during the current interim period.



5 Segment information

Segment information is presented in respect of the Group's operating segments. The activities within each of these segments are explained below:

(a) Engineering

Engineering comprises mainly revenue derived from the execution of construction contracts and income derived from infrastructure.

(b) Metering

Metering comprises mainly revenue derived from the production, marketing and trading of water related product and services.

There has been no material change in total assets and no differences in the basis of segmentation or in the basis of measurement of segment profit or loss as compared to the last annual financial statements.

5 Segment information (continued) Engineering

Revenue of RM29.51 million for the current quarter ended 31 October 2020 was 26% lower as compared to RM39.87 million for the corresponding quarter in 2019 mainly attributed to the lower revenue contribution towards the end of a project. Segment profit of RM8.49 million for the current quarter ended 31 October 2020 was 4% lower as compared to RM8.87 million for the corresponding quarter in 2019. The lower segment profit was mainly contributed by the lower revenue partly offset by cost savings realised during the current quarter.

Revenue of RM89.44 million for the current period ended 31 October 2020 was 44% lower as compared to RM160.22 million for the corresponding period in 2019 mainly attributed to the lower revenue contribution towards the end of a project. The two hospital projects' revenue was also affected by the suspension of construction activities upon the implementation of MCO on 18 March 2020 until the progressive resumption of works on 9 June 2020 and 11 June 2020. Segment profit of RM19.69 million for the period ended 31 October 2020 was 53% lower as compared to RM42.28 million for the period ended 31 October 2019 mainly due to the lower revenue.

Metering

Revenue of RM49.40 million for the current quarter ended 31 October 2020 was 49.98% higher compared to RM33.04 million for the corresponding quarter in 2019. The higher revenue is derived from both local sales to certain local authorities, local private sales as well as export sales. Segment profit of RM13.32 million for the current quarter ended 31 October 2020 was 123% higher as compared to RM5.97 million for the corresponding quarter in 2019 mainly due to the higher sales and gross profit margin in the current quarter. Gross profit margin is higher mainly due to lower cost of material as well as lower overhead expenses arising from cost savings measures in place.

Revenue of RM98.95 million for the period ended 31 October 2020 was 6% higher compared to RM93.20 million for the corresponding period in 2019. The higher revenue is derived from local private sales and export sales. Segment profit of RM22.22 million for the period ended 31 October 2020 was 45% higher as compared to RM15.29 million for the corresponding period in 2019 mainly due to the higher sales and gross profit margin. Gross profit margin is higher mainly due to lower cost of material as well as lower overhead expenses arising from cost savings measures in place.

Metering activities was also disrupted with the implementation of MCO on 18 March 2020. The Company was allowed to reactivate its production line on 20 April 2020, albeit on a limited scale. Subsequently, the Company joined other companies in the approved economic sectors in operating with full workforce capacity and without limitation in operating time effective 4 May 2020, again under strict labour movement conditions. The Company is now undertaking production in three shifts, taking care to continue adhering strictly to social distancing and hygiene measures at our production site and workers' quarters.

Consolidated revenue

The Group mainly derives its revenue from Malaysia and other ASEAN countries. Its core businesses are centred in the water industry and engineering works. The main factors which have affected the Group's revenue have been stated above.

Consolidated profit before tax

The Group's current quarter profit before tax of RM16.09 million (31 October 2019: RM12.65 million) was 27% higher. The higher profit before tax reported was mainly attributed to higher contribution from the Metering division. Other losses mainly arose from unrealised loss on foreign exchange of RM2.59 million (31 October 2019: gain of RM1.27 million) on foreign currencies held.

The Group's profit before tax for the period ended 31 October 2020 of RM31.74 million (31 October 2019: RM46.32 million) was 31% lower. The lower profit before tax reported was mainly attributed to lower contribution from the Engineering division.



6 Seasonality of operations

The Group's performance was not affected by any significant seasonal or cyclical factors.

The effective tax rate (excluding the results of associate and joint venture which is equity accounted net of tax) was higher than the statutory tax rate mainly due to withholding tax paid for dividend declared by a foreign associate.

9 Earnings Per Share

Basic earnings per share amounts are calculated by dividing profit for the period, net of tax attributable to owners by the number of ordinary shares outstanding during the period.

Diluted earnings per share amounts are calculated by dividing profit for the period, net of tax attributable to owners by the weighted average number of ordinary shares outstanding during the period, plus the weighted average number of ordinary shares that would be issued on the conversion of the dilutive potential ordinary shares into ordinary shares.

Computer software

Computer software are stated at cost less any accumulated impairment losses and are amortised on a straightline basis over the estimated economic useful lives at the annual rate of 20%. The amortisation of computer software is recognised in profit or loss.

License

License considered to have finite useful lives, is stated at cost less any accumulated impairment losses and is amortised using the straight-line basis from the later of commencement of the contract to which it relates or when all the related machinery and equipment are ready for their intended use over the period of their expected benefit not exceeding 10 years.

Product development costs

Product development costs relate to costs incurred in the development of new products, considered to have finite useful lives, are stated at cost less any accumulated impairment losses and are amortised over the period of expected benefit not exceeding 10 years on straight-line basis. The amortisation of product development costs is recognised in profit or loss.

17 Share capital and treasury shares

At the 69th AGM of the Company held on 29 July 2020, shareholders' approval was obtained for the Share Buy-Back scheme to be renewed from 29 July 2020 until the conclusion of the next AGM of the Company to be convened in 2021.

As at 31 October 2020, the Company repurchased a total of 36,657,900 of its shares from the open market for a total consideration of RM35,052,330. Subsequent to 31 October 2020 and up to date of this announcement, a total of 676,300 shares were repurchased from the open market for a total consideration of RM533,887. All these repurchased shares are being held as Treasury Shares in accordance with Section 127 of the Companies Act, 2016 and no Treasury Shares have been cancelled or resold to date. The repurchase of these shares were financed by internally generated funds.

22 Contingencies

Apart from what was reported in our announcement for the second quarter of the financial year, dated 14 September 2020, nothing has changed except that:

- (i) the Custom's appeal to the High Court has been adjourned to a date to be fixed.
- (ii) the Company's application on judicial review proceedings was fixed for hearing on 11 Nov 2020. On 30 Sept 2020 Customs filed an application to Stay the Judicial Review pending disposal of Customs appeal to the Tribunal's decision to the High Court. GKM opposed the stay application. The Stay application was heard on 8 Dec 2020 wherein the Court granted Customs stay of our Judicial Review application until the disposal of Customs appeal. The hearing of the Judicial Review application will now be postponed to a date to be fixed after the Customs appeal is heard; and
- (iii) the Company has filed an application for leave to file judicial review against Custom's decision to issue the Bill of Demand against the Company. The case is scheduled to be heard on 15 December 2020.

The profit before taxation for the current quarter ended 31 October 2020 is 38% higher than the preceding quarter due to higher profit contributed by Metering divisions.

28 Commentary on prospects

The Group's commendable Q3FY2021 results were primarily due to strong water meter sales in the Group's local and export markets. In spite of the people movement controls implemented domestically since 18 March 2020 and in many countries abroad since early in the year, water meter orders continued unabated. This demonstrates the robustness of the Metering Business. However, production was affected in the earlier stages of the Movement Control Order (MCO), resulting in an order backlog. The Group in Q3FY2021 continued to adhere to prevailing SOPs whilst gradually restoring its manufacturing capacity to clear the backlog and cater for new orders from local and regional water authorities. The Metering division will continue to do well in the remaining quarter of the financial year and beyond. There are plans to increase the capacity further.

Construction activities ceased completely during the MCO but were restarted mid-June 2020 following the completion of mandatory foreign worker health screenings. In Q3FY2021, the Group continued to accelerate its progress on the two hospital projects with its increased adaptation to the SOPs.

Metering

Local and overseas demand for the Group's renowned water meters continues to outstrip supply. In Q3FY2021, the Group continued to adhere to the Malaysian Government's SOPs in gradually restoring its manufacturing capacity to clear its backlog of orders and cater for new orders. The Group will continue to comply with any changes to government guidelines in managing its production activities.

It is the Group's strategy to become a one-stop purveyor of water meters. We are actively expanding our product portfolio through partnerships with other manufacturers. The enlarged range will give us a stronger footing to penetrate more markets globally.

The Group's long-term license agreement with Honeywell enhances our control over component supply and production costs. It also gives us the right to sell water meters to 15 new territories in Asia. Production has commenced in stages.

The Group's proprietary Smart Metering technology is undergoing real-world tests through POCs and pilot projects with state water authorities. We are pursuing other such opportunities both in Malaysia and the region.

Engineering

The Group continued to adapt to prevailing SOPs in Q3FY2021 as it accelerated progress on Hospital Tanjung Karang and Hospital Endokrin Putrajaya.

Jabatan Kerja Raya has approved one of the Group's Extension of Time applications in the quarter under review, in acknowledgement of the disruptions caused by the MCO. The Group will continue to work closely with the Department in managing the delivery timelines for the two hospitals.

The Group is dedicated to developing new opportunities in the Regional railway space, leveraging on our expertise as rail systems specialist in domestic railway projects. Our established network with international rail specialists will assist us in tapping into Regional projects requiring international collaborations through joint ventures or strategic alliances.
