Review of performance (Quarter 2, 2019 vs Quarter 2, 2018)

For the second quarter ended 30 June 2019, the Group recorded a 2.0% increase in Turnover to RM1.34 billion. Factoring in the divestment of the Chilled Dairy business on 1 January 2019, this represents a robust 3.4% increase in growth year-on-year. When excluding the Chilled Dairy Business, domestic sales recorded a strong 6.8% growth over same period last year.

The strong domestic sales were achieved through focused sales execution, adequate marketing support and our efforts to capture the opportunities offered by the festive season. We have also maintained our innovation focus and the new products launched in Q2, such as NESCAFE Gold Jar relaunch, MAGGI Pedas Giler 2X Ayam Bakar, MAGGI Pedas Giler Seafood, LA CREMERIA Summer Berries Yogurt Ice Cream and KIT KAT Popcorn flavour, provide further platforms and confidence in our ability to generate sustainable growth.

The Group recorded another period of good margins with Profit Before Tax of RM199 million and Profit After Tax of RM157 million for its second quarter. The Group also recognized a one-off gain of RM19.7 million from the divestment of the Petaling Jaya factory and the manufacturing business in relation to chilled dairy products, cold sauces and packing of milk powders.

Review of performance (Year-to-date, 2019 vs Year-to-date, 2018)

For the first half ended 30 June 2019, the Group registered a turnover of RM2.79 billion, 1.8% increase from the same period in 2018 (3.5% adjusting for the divestment of the Chilled Dairy business) on the back of stronger domestic sales growing at 4.1% (6.1% net of Chilled Dairy divestment). This was mainly driven by positive offtake for our brands on the back of robust demand and successful Chinese New Year and Hari Raya festive sales.

Successful product innovations and portfolio renovation have continued to drive domestic growth momentum in H1 2019. These include, in addition to the above mentioned launches in Q2, those introduced in Q1, such as MILO Whole Grains Cereal, NESCAFÉ Blend & Brew White Coffee, NESTUM Brown Rice and NESCAFE Tarik Kurang Manis.

Profit Before Tax increased slightly from RM509 million to RM512 million, against a backdrop of challenging external conditions, including exchange rates volatility, higher commodity prices and volatile international conditions. Profit After Tax reduced slightly to RM392 million due to higher income tax arising from the expiration of investment incentive.

Variation of results against previous quarter (Quarter 2, 2019 vs. Quarter 1, 2019)

For the second quarter, the Group registered a turnover of RM1.34 billion, 8.1% lower than the first quarter of 2019. This is due to the seasonality of our business as the strong sales during the Chinese New Year period contributed to a high Q1 turnover. Our growth momentum in Q2 demonstrates the strength of our domestic business and reflects our effort to drive sustainable demand for our brands.

The quarterly profitability, while remaining strong, has been impacted by the phasing of our commercial spending as well as some one-off warehousing expenses in preparation for the factory expansion in Chembong, as well as the slightly higher cost of commodities, which were mitigated by the hedging measures in place.

Current year prospects

We remain confident in our full year performance against a backdrop of global uncertainties and volatility. Our fundamentals remain strong and we continue to focus on consumer driven commercial activities to maintain our growth momentum. We have an exciting stream of new launches planned for the second half of 2019 and our teams are committed to capture all the opportunities available to grow the business. The recent introduction of the "Starbucks At Home" range in Malaysia building on Nestle's Global Coffee Alliance with Starbucks is just the most recent example of our commitment to bring to Malaysian consumers exciting experiences and to capture all opportunities for growth.

We will continue driving efficiencies and savings to invest behind our brands and protect our margins to counter rising commodity prices and to manage input costs.

12 Material litigation

Nestlé Products Sdn. Bhd. ("NPSB"), the wholly owned subsidiary of Nestlé (Malaysia) Berhad (110925-W) ("the Company") was served with a sealed Writ of Summons and Statement of Claim dated 6 March 2019, filed by Mad Labs Sdn. Bhd. ("Mad Labs"). The claim by Mad Labs against NPSB is for amongst others, the sum of RM 139,344,262.25. An amended Writ of Summons dated 21 March 2019 was further filed by Mad Labs and served subsequently on 25 March 2019.

In the Statement of Claim, Mad Labs is alleging inter alia, the unauthorised and/or unlawful use of Mad Lab's QR Code, breach of an implied contract between Mad Labs and NPSB by reason of NPSB's continued use of the QR Code, unjust enrichment of NPSB by the use of the QR Code, compensation for the services which Mad Labs has rendered to NPSB and NPSB's negligence in using Mad Labs's QR Code on its products/packaging.

NPSB has filed and served its Statement of Defence dated 22 April 2019 to dispute the claims made by Mad Labs. In addition to filing the Statement of Defence, NPSB has separately filed an action at the Intellectual Property Court against Mad Labs and its sole director and shareholder, Chow Kien Loon ("CKL") for amongst others, to challenge the ownership of Mad Labs in the QR Code, negligence, unlawful interference with trade as well as defamation and trade libel. Mad Labs and CKL have been served the sealed Writ of Summons and Statement of Claim dated 23 April 2019 filed by NPSB through its solicitors.

Both NPSB and Mad Labs are in the midst of complying with pre-trial directions by the Courts.

Based on the opinion rendered by solicitors representing NPSB, Messrs. Zaid Ibrahim & Co., NPSB has a reasonably strong case against Mad Labs and CKL. Accordingly, the Board is of the opinion that no provision needs to be made for this claim.

13 Dividend

The Board of Directors has declared an interim dividend of 70.00 sen per share (2018: 70.00 sen per share) in respect of financial year ending 31 December 2019 which will be paid on 10 October 2019 to shareholders whose names appear on the Record of Depositors on 17 September 2019. Under current rules, single-tier dividends are not taxable in the hand of shareholders.

A Depositor shall qualify for entitlement only in respect of:

- a. shares transferred into the Depositor's Securities Account before 5.00 p.m. on 17 September 2019 in respect of ordinary transfers.
