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Introduction

This report has been prepared by PricewaterhouseCoopers, the approved company's auditors, for inclusion in the Prospectus of Kinsteel Bhd to be dated 30 September 2002 the Public Issue of 10,000,000 new ordinary shares of RM1.00 each and offer for sale of 5,100,000 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each in Kinsteel Bhd at an issue/offer price of RM1.80 per share and the listing of and quotation for the entire enlarged issued and paid up share capital of 60,000,000 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each in Kinsteel Bhd on the Main Board of the Kuala Lumpur Stock Exchange ('KLSE').

General information 2

Background and principal activities 2.1

Kinsteel Bhd was incorporated in Malaysia on 3 January 1991 under the Companies Act, 1965 as a private limited company under the name of Kin Kee Steel Sdn Bhd. On 21 April 1997, the name of the Company was changed to Kinsteel Sdn Bhd. On 25 April 1997 the Company was converted into a public limited company and changed to its present name.

The principal activities of Kinsteel Bhd are that of investment holding and the manufacturing and trading of iron, steel bars and related products. There have been no significant changes in the nature of these activities from the date of incorporation except that Kinsteel Bhd traded in iron ore on ad hoc basis since the financial year ended 31 December 1999.

3 Ultimate and immediate holding companies

The ultimate and immediate holding companies of Kinsteel Bhd are Perniagaan Kin Kee Sdn Bhd and Kin Kee Holdings Sdn Bhd ('Kin Kee') respectively. Perniagaan Kin Kee Sdn Bhd holds 60.7% equity in Kin Kee which in turn holds 69.2% equity in Kinsteel Bhd as at the date of this report.

4 Flotation Scheme

In conjunction with and as part of the listing of and quotation for the entire enlarged issued and paid up share capital of Kinsteel Bhd on the Main Board of the KLSE, Kinsteel Bhd undertook the following Flotation Scheme as approved by the relevant authorities.

4.1 Conversion of preference shares

4,800,003 RCPS had been converted into 1,714,287 new ordinary shares of RM1.00 each in Kinsteel Bhd credited as fully paid up at RM2.80 RCPS for 1 new ordinary share of RM1.00 each in Kinsteel Bhd. The special RCPS ('SRCPS') of 2,571,433 was converted into 2,571,433 new ordinary shares of RM1.00 each in Kinsteel Bhd credited as fully paid up at RM1.00 SRCPS for 1 new ordinary share of RM1.00 each in Kinsteel Bhd.

The new ordinary shares of RM1.00 each in Kinsteel Bhd to be issued pursuant to the conversion of preference shares will rank pari passu with the existing ordinary shares of RM1.00 each in Kinsteel Bhd.

The conversion of preference shares was completed on 30 August 2002.

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4.2 Bonus Issue

Bonus Issue of 28,502,841 new ordinary shares of RM1.00 each in Kinsteel Bhd on the basis of approximately 1,326 new ordinary shares of RM1.00 each in Kinsteel Bhd for every 1,000 existing ordinary shares of RM1.00 each in Kinsteel Bhd held after the conversion of preference shares by capitalising RM3,085,716 from the share premium account and RM25,417,125 from the retained earnings of Kinsteel Bhd.

The new ordinary shares of RM1.00 each in Kinsteel Bhd to be issued pursuant to the Bonus Issue will rank pari passu with the existing ordinary shares of RM1.00 each in Kinsteel Bhd.

The Bonus Issue was completed on 4 September 2002.

4.3 Offer for Sale

The Offer for Sale of 5,100,000 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each in Kinsteel Bhd at an offer price of RM1.80 per ordinary share to Bumiputra Investors and institutions approved by Ministry of International Trade and Industry ('MITI').

4.4 Public Issue

Public Issue of 10,000,000 new ordinary shares of RM1.00 each in Kinsteel Bhd at an issue price of RM1.80 per ordinary share to the Malaysian Public, eligible employees, customers and Directors of Kinsteel Group.

4.5 Listing on the Main Board of the KLSE

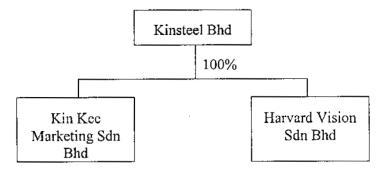

KKM was incorporated in Malaysia on 13 October 1989 under the Companies Act, 1965 as a private limited company under the name of Pusat Pemborong Ikan Pengkalan Kuantan Sdn Bhd ('PIPK'). On 1 July 1993, PIPK changed its name to Kin Kee Marketing Sdn Bhd.

The principal activity of KKM is that of trading in iron, steel bars and related products. KKM only commenced its activity in the financial year ended 31 December 1994.

5.1.2 Share capital

The authorised share capital of KKM since its incorporation date is RM2,000,000 comprising 2,000,000 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each.

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6.1 Group accounting policies

(a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Group and Company have been prepared under the historical cost convention, unless otherwise indicated in the individual policy statements to the financial statements.

The financial statements comply with the current applicable approved accounting standards in Malaysia and the provisions of the Companies Act, 1965. As permitted by MASB Standard 24 - Financial Instruments: Disclosure and Presentation, comparatives are not disclosed upon first application of the Standard.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the current applicable approved accounting standards in Malaysia and the provisions of the Companies Act, 1965 requires the Directors to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reported year. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(b) Subsidiaries

Subsidiaries are those companies in which the Group has power to exercise control over the financial and operating policies so as to obtain benefits from their activities. Subsidiaries are consolidated from the date on which control is transferred to the Group and are no longer consolidated from the date that control ceases.

Subsidiaries are consolidated using the acquisition method of accounting. Under the acquisition method of accounting, the results of subsidiaries acquired or disposed of are included from the date of acquisition up to the date of disposal. At the date of acquisition, the fair values of the subsidiaries' net assets are determined and these values are reflected in the consolidated financial statements. The excess of the cost of acquisition over the fair value of the Group's share of the subsidiaries identifiable net assets at the date of acquisition is reflected as goodwill on consolidation.

Intragroup transactions, balances and unrealised gains on transactions are eliminated; unrealised losses are also eliminated unless cost cannot be recovered. Where necessary, adjustments are made to the financial statements of subsidiaries to ensure consistency of accounting policies with those of the Group.

(c) Investments

Investments in subsidiaries are shown at cost and an allowance for diminution in value is made where, in the opinion of the Directors, there is a decline other than temporary in the value of the investments. Where there has been a decline other than temporary in the value of an investment, such a decline is recognised as an expense in the period in which the decline is identified.

On disposal of an investment, the difference between net disposal proceeds and its carrying amount is charged/credited to the income statement.

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6.1 Group accounting policies (continued)

(d) Cash and cash equivalents

For the purposes of the cash flow statement, cash and cash equivalents comprise cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, bank overdrafts and short term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

(e) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. The cost of property, plant and equipment comprises their purchase cost and any incidental costs of acquisition.

Leasehold land is amortised in equal instalments over the period of the respective leases that range from 66 to 99 years. Other property, plant and equipment are depreciated on a straight line basis to write off the cost of the assets to their residual values over their estimated useful lives at the following annual rates:

Tools and implements are not depreciated as it is charged to the income statement on replacement basis.

Depreciation on assets under construction commences when the assets are ready for their intended use.

Where an indication of impairment exists, the carrying amount of the asset is assessed and written down immediately to its recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with carrying amount and are included in profit/(loss) from operations.

(f) Inventories

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined using the weighted average method. The cost of finished goods comprises raw materials, direct labour, other direct costs and an appropriate proportion of production overheads. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the costs of completion and selling expenses.

(g) Trade receivables

Trade receivables are carried at invoiced amount less an estimate made for doubtful debts based on a review of outstanding amounts at the period end. Bad debts are written off when identified.

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6.1 Group accounting policies (continued)

(h) Assets acquired under hire purchase agreement

Assets acquired under hire purchase agreement are included in property, plant and equipment and the capital element of the hire purchase commitments is shown as borrowings. The capital element of the hire purchase instalment is applied to reduce the outstanding obligations and the interest element is charged to the income statement so as to give a constant periodic rate of interest on the outstanding liability at the end of each accounting period. Assets acquired under hire purchase agreement are depreciated over the useful lives of equivalent owned assets.

(i) Deferred taxation

The tax expense is determined on the basis of tax effect accounting using the liability method. Deferred taxation is recognised for timing differences except when there is reasonable evidence that such timing differences will not reverse in the foreseeable future. The tax effect of timing differences that result in a debit balance or a debit to the deferred tax balance is not carried forward unless there is a reasonable expectation of its realisation.

The potential tax saving relating to a tax loss carry forward is only recognised if there is assurance beyond any reasonable doubt that future taxable income will be sufficient for the benefit of the loss to be realised.

(j) Revenue recognition

Sales are recognised upon delivery of products and customer acceptance, if any, net of discounts, and after eliminating sales within the Group.

Income from rental and interest are recognised on accrual basis.

(k) Foreign currencies

Foreign currency transactions in Group companies are accounted for at exchange rates prevailing at the transaction dates, unless hedged by forward foreign exchange contracts, in which case the rates specified in such forward contracts are used. Foreign currency monetary assets and liabilities are translated at exchange rates prevailing at the balance sheet date, unless hedged by forward foreign exchange contracts, in which case the rates specified in such forward contracts are used. Exchange differences arising from the settlement of foreign currency transactions and from the translation of foreign currency monetary assets and liabilities are included in the income statement.

(l) Financial instruments

(i) Financial instruments recognised on the balance sheet

The particular recognition method adopted for financial instruments recognised on the balance sheet is disclosed in the individual policy statements associated with each item.

(ii) Financial instruments not recognised on the balance sheet

The Group is a party to financial instruments which comprise foreign currency forward contracts agreements. These instruments are not recognised in the financial statements on inception. The Group enters into foreign currency forward contracts to protect the Group from movements in exchange rates by establishing the rate at which a foreign currency asset or liability will be settled.

(iii) Fair value estimation for disclosure purposes

The fair value of forward foreign exchange contracts is determined by obtaining quotes from brokers.

The carrying amounts of cash and short term investments approximate fair values because of the short maturity periods of those instruments.

In assessing the value of borrowings, the Group assumes that the interest rates on borrowings approximate the current market interest rates and accordingly the carrying values approximate the fair values.

The fair values for financial assets and liabilities with a maturity of less than one year are assumed to approximate their fair values.

6.2 Financial risk management objectives and policies

The Group is inherently exposed to the following financial risks in its day to day operations:

(a) Foreign currency exchange risk

The objective of the Group's foreign exchange policy is to allow the Group to manage exposures that arise from trading activities within a framework of controls that does not expose the Group to unnecessary foreign exchange risks. The Group covers substantially all foreign exchange exposures arising from its foreign payables and on cash flows to be used in anticipated transactions denominated in foreign currencies and operate to the extent of the Group's foreign exchange commitment.

Foreign currency exchange risk arises mainly from the importation of raw materials and machinery and parts which are mainly stated in US currency. Despite the fact that the Malaysian Ringgit is currently pegged against the US Dollar and remains quite stable, the Board maintains the policy to use foreign exchange contracts to hedge against material exposure to the foreign exchange risks. The usage of such instrument enables the costing and the cash flows of large orders of raw materials and machinery and parts denominated in foreign currencies to be determined following contracting with the foreign suppliers and the issuance of the respective letter of credits.

(b) Interest rate risk

The Group exposure to interest rate fluctuations is due to the Group's borrowings being mainly dependant on the lending financial institutions base lending rates and market cost of funds particularly for its term loans, overdrafts and trade financing loans.

(c) Credit risk

The Group seeks to invest cash assets safely and profitably. It also seeks to control credit risks by setting appropriate credit terms and limits for customers and ensuring that sales of products are made to customers with good credit assessment.

(d) Liquidity and cash flow risk

The Group exercise prudent liquidity risk management to maintain sufficient cash and short term investments and the availability of funding through an adequate amount of credit facilities.

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7 Auditors and audit reports

Kinsteel Bhd and KKM

The financial statements of Kinsteel Bhd and KKM for the financial years ended 31 December 1999, 2000 and 2001 and the four months ended 30 April 2002 were audited by PricewaterhouseCoopers without any qualifications. The financial statements of Kinsteel Bhd and KKM were audited by our legacy firm of Coopers & Lybrand for the financial years ended 31 December 1995, 1996, 1997 and 1998 without any qualifications. Prior to 1995, the financial statements were audited by another firm of auditors.

Harvard

The financial statements of Harvard for the financial years ended 31 December 1999, 2000 and 2001 and the four months ended 30 April 2002 were audited by PricewaterhouseCoopers without any qualifications. The financial statements prior to 1999 were audited by our legacy firm of Coopers & Lybrand without any qualifications.

8 Dividend

Kinsteel Bhd and its subsidiaries have not paid or declared any dividend for the five financial years from 31 December 1997 to 31 December 2001 and the four months ended 30 April 2002.

Credit risk is controlled by setting appropriate credit terms and limits for all customers and ensuring that sales of products are made to customers with good credit assessment. Credit terms of trade receivables range from 14 to 90 days. As at 30 April 2002, 66% of the trade receivables are owed by five customers. Included in these five customers is an amount of RM8,920,294 due from the trading of iron ore which the Group has a right of set-off against future supplies of steel billets, as disclosed in Note 9.1 (iv) segment reporting.

The allowance for doubtful debts is considered adequate.

The amounts due from ultimate holding company arose from trade transactions conducted at normal trade terms and are unsecured, free of interest and are repayable within the normal trade credit periods.
