NOTES TO THE INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORT

PART A: EXPLANATORY NOTES PURSUANT TO MFRS 134

1. Basis of Preparation

The interim financial statements are unaudited and have been prepared in accordance with Malaysian Financial Reporting Standards ("MFRS") 134: Interim Financial Reporting issued by the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board ("MASB") and Paragraph 9.22 of the Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad ("Bursa Malaysia"). These interim financial statements also comply with IAS 34 Interim Financial Reporting issued by the International Accounting Standards Board.

The interim financial statements should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements of the Group for the year ended 30 April 2019. These explanatory notes attached to the interim financial statements provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the financial year ended 30 April 2019.

2. Significant accounting policies

The significant accounting policies adopted in preparing these condensed consolidated interim financial statements are consistent with those of the audited financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2019 except for the adoption of the following new MFRSs and Interpretations, and amendments to certain MFRSs and Interpretations with effect from 1 May 2019:

- MFRS 9 Prepayment Features with Negative Compensation (Amendments to MFRS
 9)
- MFRS 16 Leases
- MFRS 128 Long-term Interests in Associates and Joint Ventures (Amendments to MFRS 128)
- Annual Improvements to MFRS Standards 2015–2017 Cycle
- MFRS 119 Plan Amendment, Curtailment or Settlement (Amendments to MFRS 119)
- IC Interpretation 23 Uncertainty over Income Tax Treatments

The adoption of the above standards and interpretations did not have any material effect on the financial performance or position of the Group, except as disclosed below:

MFRS 16 Leases

MFRS 16 will replace MFRS 117 Leases, IC Interpretation 4 Determining whether an Arrangement contains a Lease, IC Interpretation 115 Operating Lease-Incentives and IC Interpretation 127 Evaluating the Substance of Transactions Involving the Legal Form of a Lease. MFRS 16 sets out the principles for the recognition, measurement, presentation and disclosure of leases and requires lessees to account for all leases under a single onbalance sheet model similar to the accounting for finance leases under MFRS 117.

At the commencement date of a lease, a lessee will recognise a liability to make lease payments and an asset representing the right to use the underlying asset during the lease term. Lessees will be required to recognise interest expense on the lease liability and the depreciation expense on the right-of-use asset.

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Lessor accounting under MFRS 16 is substantially the same as the accounting under MFRS 117. Lessors will continue to classify all leases using the same classification principle as in MFRS 117 and distinguish between two types of leases: operating and finance leases.

MFRS 16 is effective for annual periods beginning on or after 1 January 2019. As allowed by the transitional provision of MFRS 16, the Group has elected the modified restrospective approach with no restatement of comparative and the cumulative adjustments resulting from initial application of MFRS 16 to be recognised in retained profits as at 1 May 2019.

As a result of initial applying MFRS 16, in relation to the leases that were previously classified as operating leases, the Group recognised RM1.7 million of right- of- use assets and lease liabilities as at 31 July 2019.

The standards and interpretations that are issued but not yet effective up to the date of issuance of these condensed consolidated interim financial statements are disclosed below. The Group intend to adopt these standards, if applicable, when they become effective.

3. Significant Accounting Estimates And Judgements

(a) Critical Judgements Made in Applying Accounting Policies

There are no critical judgements made by management in the process of applying the Group's accounting policies that have significant effect on the amounts recognised in the financial statements.

(b) Key Sources of Estimation Uncertainty

The key assumptions concerning the future and other key sources of estimation uncertainty at the operating date, that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are discussed below.

(i) Deferred tax assets

Deferred tax assets are recognised for all unused tax losses, unabsorbed capital allowances and unused reinvestment allowance to the extent that it is probable that taxable profit will be available against which the losses, capital allowances and reinvestment allowance can be utilised. Significant management judgement is required to determine the amount of deferred tax assets that can be recognised, based upon the likely timing and level of future taxable profits together with future tax planning strategies. The total carrying value of unrecognised tax losses and capital allowances of the Group was RM124.1 million (30.4.2019: RM121.3 million).

(ii) Depreciation of plant and equipment

The cost of paper making machinery is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the assets' useful lives. Management estimates the useful lives of these plant and machinery to be within ten years. These are common life expectancies applied in the industry. Changes in the expected level of usage and technological developments could impact the economic useful lives and the residual values of these assets, therefore future depreciation charges could be revised.

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NOTES TO THE INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORT

(iii) Impairment of property, plant and equipment

The Group assesses whether there are any indicators of impairment for all non-financial assets at each reporting date. Other non-financial assets are tested for impairment when there are indicators that the carrying amounts may not be recoverable. Impairment exists when the carrying amount of an asset or cash generating unit exceeds its recoverable amount, which is the higher of its value in use and its fair value less cost of disposal.

Where there is objective evidence of impairment, the amount and timing of future cash flows are estimated based on historical loss experience for assets with similar credit risk characteristics.

(iv) Customer rebates

The Group had recognised provision for sales rebate according to the contractual arrangements entered into with its customers. Estimating the provision for sales rebate requires the Group to make an estimate based on historical experiences, contractual arrangement and on the claims expected to be made by customers. The Group assessed the provisions at each reporting date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimate. Where it is no longer probable that an outflow of economic resources will be required to settle the obligation, the provision for sales rebate is reversed.

4. Auditors' Report on Preceding Annual Financial Statements

The auditors' report on the financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2019 was not subject to any audit qualification.

5. Seasonal or cyclical factors

The business of the Group was not affected by any significant seasonal or cyclical factors during the financial period under review.

6. Unusual items

There were no unusual items affecting assets, liabilities, equity, net income or cash flows of the Group for the current financial year.

7. Changes in estimates

There were no material changes in estimates of amount reported in prior interim period or financial period that have a material effect in the current year.

Group

Group revenue for the period ended 31 July 2019 was RM184.9 million compared with RM172.4 million for the period ended 31 July 2018, an increase of 7.2%. The increase was mainly due to the increase in sales of Tissue segment, especially to local sales. The Group's profit before taxation for the period ended 31 July 2019 was RM3.1 million, a decrease of 70.5% over RM10.5 million registered in the previous financial period ended 31 July 2018. The decrease in profit before taxation was mainly due to the higher raw material cost and overhead cost recorded in the current period under review as compare to previous period. The key factors that affect the performance include higher cost in raw material consumed such as virgin pulp and waste paper and re-introduction of the Sales and Service Tax. This was mainly due to no input tax claimable under SST and no exemption applicable to non- taxable products especially to Baby diapers, Sanitary napkin and UnderPad products.

Paper Products segment

Revenue from the paper products segment for the period ended 31 July 2019 was RM133.7 million compared with RM123.5 million for the financial period ended 31 July 2018, an increase of 8.3%. Profit before taxation in the paper products segment for the period ended 31 July 2019 was RM0.7 million, a decrease of 85% over RM4.7 million registered in the previous financial period. The key factors that affect the performance of tissue products include the higher cost in raw material such as virgin pulp and waste paper, and overhead cost.



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Personal Care Products segment

Revenue from the personal care products segment for the period ended 31 July 2019 was RM51.2 million compared with RM48.9 million recorded in the previous year corresponding period, an increase of 4.7%. Profit before taxation in the personal care products segment for the period ended 31 July 2019 was RM2.4 million, a decrease of 58.6% over RM5.8 million registered in the corresponding period of the previous financial year. The decrease in profit before taxation was mainly due to the higher raw material cost consumed recorded in the current period. The re-introduction of the Sales and Service Tax has increased the price of material. This was mainly due to no input tax claimable under SST and no exemption applicable to non- taxable products, e.g Baby diapers, Sanitary napkin and UnderPad produts.

Revenue for the quarter ended 31 July 2019 increased by RM2.7 million or 1.5%. The increase was mainly due to the increase in sales especially Personal Care Products segment. While, profit before taxation increased by RM4.5 million or 316.6% for the current quarter as compared to the preceding quarter. The increase in the Group's consolidated profit before taxation as compared to the preceding quarter was mainly due to recognition of unrealized loss in foreign exchange in preceding quarter and decreased selling, distribution and other administration expenses recorded in the current financial quarter.

17. Prospects

The global tissue market paper is expected to grow at a compounded annual growth rate of close to 3.6% during the period of 2019 to 2027. Factors of growing population and increasing awareness about hygiene in the developing countries will have positive influence on the global tissue paper market. The key focus in FY2020 is to increase production of tissue paper in order to fulfil the increasing demand in South East Asia and other export markets.

Nevertheless, consumer demand is expected to remain weak and unstable in the short term. Inflation cost is expected to remain. With well-established product offerings, supported by its comprehensive distribution and marketing channels, the Group foresees that it would continue to grow organically in its existing markets.



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Board is cautiously optimistic about its prospect, even though the market conditions are expected to be more challenging. However, the positive factor is that pulp price softening and cost of fibre is expected to drop.
