#### A1. Basis of preparation

The unaudited interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with MFRS 134 *Interim Financial Reporting* issued by the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board ("MASB") and Paragraph 9.22 of the Main Market Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad ("Bursa Securities").

The interim financial statements contain condensed consolidated financial statement and selected explanatory notes. The notes include an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to the understanding of the changes in financial position and performance of TAS Offshore and its subsidiaries ("the Group"). The interim financial statements and notes thereon do not include all the information required for a full set of financial statements prepared in accordance with Malaysian Financial Reporting Standards ("MFRS") and should be read in conjunction with the consolidated financial statements of the Group for the financial year ended 31 May 2018.

In the opinion of the directors, the result for the current quarter and financial period to date have not been affected by any transactions or events of a material nature which has arisen between 31 May 2018 and the date of this report.

The Group recorded lower revenue of RM3.4 million representing a decrease of RM5.3 million or 61% lower than the preceding quarter. The higher revenue recorded in preceding quarter was attributable to revenue recognised on delivery of two units of tugboat.

Profit before tax for the current quarter amounting to RM3.7 million as compared with preceding quarter loss of RM1.01 million representing an increase of RM4.7 million over the preceding quarter. The profit recorded during current quarter is mainly attributable to gain on disposal of property, plant and equipment and higher unrealised foreign exchange gain.

## B3. Commentary on prospects

The oil price rose to about \$63 a barrel due to political tensions in the Persian Gulf, following Iran's seizure of a UK-flagged oil tanker. Amid the uncertainty in oil and gas industry, the industry players is optimistic on positive outlook in the longer term and potential surge in demand for offshore support vessels. Goldman Sachs analysts had predicted the oil demand may rebound in the second half of this year, offering some upside to oil prices. A few reasons were cited for their prediction, including strong consumer demand, recent positive data from the refining sector on end-use demand, plus an overall strengthening of the macroeconomic picture.

The Indonesian coal sector still offers attractive prospects. Coal usage in generating electricity increases strongly as coal in Indonesia has a higher reserve to prodution ratio compared to oil and gas. (Source: IESR Report, 1st Edition) The bright outlook for coal mining industry in Indonesia will have positive impact on the mining support services industry such as transportation activities and is expected to spur demand for more tugboats. Our Group is looking forward to reap further benefit from this development.

We are optimistic about our prospect.
