

NOTES TO THE UNAUDITED INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

PART A – EXPLANATORY NOTES PURSUANT TO THE FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS ("FRS") 134: INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORTING

1. Basis of Preparation

The interim financial statements are unaudited and have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of Financial Reporting Standards (FRS) 134: Interim Financial Reporting and Chapter 9, Appendix 9B of the Listing Requirements.

The interim financial statements should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements of Homeritz Corporation Berhad ("Homeriz" or the "Company") and its subsidiaries ("Group") for the financial year ended 31 August 2010 and the accompanying explanatory notes attached to this interim financial statements.

These explanatory notes attached to the interim financial statements provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the financial year ended 31 August 2010.

The Group applies revised FRS 101 (2009) which became effective as of 1 January 2010. As a result, the Group presents all non-owner changes in equity in the consolidated statement of comprehensive income. Comparative information has been re-presented so that it is in conformity with the revised standard. Since the change only affects presentation aspects, there is no impact on earnings per ordinary share.

Amendment to FRS 117: Leases

The adoption of the Amendment to FRS 117 has resulted in retrospective change in the accounting policy relating to the classification of the leasehold land. Prior to 1 September 2010, the considerations paid for the leasehold land were classified and presented as prepaid lease payments in the statement of financial position.

With the adoption of the Amendment to FRS 117, the Group has reassessed and determined that all leasehold land of the Group which is in substance financial leases and has reclassified the leasehold land to property, plant and equipment. The change in accounting policy has been made retrospectively in accordance with the transitional provisions of the amendment.

FRS 139: Financial instruments: Recognition and Measurement

Prior to the adoption of FRS 139, financial derivatives were recognised on their settlement dates. Outstanding derivatives at the balance sheet date were not recognised. With the adoption of FRS 139, all financial assets and liabilities, including derivatives, are recognised at contract dates when, and only when, the Company or any subsidiary becomes a party to the contractual provision of the instruments.

In accordance with FRS 139, the recognition, derecognition and measurement requirement are applied prospectively from 1 September 2010. The effects of the remeasurement on 1 September 2010 of the financial assets and financial liabilities brought forward from the previous financial year are adjusted to the opening retained profits and other operating reserves as disclosed in the statement of changes in equity. 14. Segment Information

The Group operates in a single industry in the business of design, manufacture and sale of upholstery furniture products in Malaysia. Accordingly, segmental information by industry and geographical segments has not been presented.



B. EXPLANATORY NOTES PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 9, APPENDIX 9B OF THE LISTING REQUIREMENTS OF BURSA MALAYSIA SECURITIES BERHAD

1. Review of Performance

The Group's revenue of RM24.5 million for the current financial period ended 30 November 2010 (Q12011) is lower than the revenue in the previous corresponding financial period ended 30 November 2009 (Q12010) of RM30.7 million. The decrease of 20.19% in turnover is mainly due to lower sales volume and the weakening of the US dollar. The profit before tax for Q12011 decreased substantially to RM3.819 million as compared to RM6.388 million recorded in the Q12010. This is mainly attributed by lower revenue generated in current quarter, the continued weakening of the US dollar coupled with the time lag in passing on the higher costs to its customers and recognisation of net fair value loss on foreign exchange derivatives in Q12011.

The average US dollar against Ringgit weakened by 9.3%, (from RM3.43 in 1Q2010 to RM3.11 in 1Q2011) during the quarter under review compared with the previous corresponding quarter.

2. Comparison with Preceding Quarter's Results

The Group recorded a profit before tax of RM3.819 million for the current quarter as compared to a profit before tax of RM4.585 million in the preceding quarter. The decrease was mainly due to the continued weakening of the US dollar coupled with the time lag in passing on the higher costs to its customers and recognisation of net fair value loss on foreign exchange derivatives in current quarter.

3. Current Year Prospects

The Group will continue to remain focused in its core business of design, manufacture, and sale of upholstered home furniture which includes upholstered sofas, upholstered dining chairs and upholstered bed frames. The Group is continuing with the effort to develop new products, new design for existing products, derive better cost efficiencies and effective cost management across all functions. Barring unforeseen circumstances, the Board believes that the Group would continue to be profitable in the current financial year ending 31 August 2011.

The Group has not issued any profit forecast or profit guarantee.

The entire enlarged issued and paid-up share capital of RM40,000,000-00 comprising of 200,000,000 ordinary shares of RM0.20 each of the Company is listed on the Main Market of Bursa Securities on 19 February 2010.
