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## NOTES TO THE CONDENSED FINANCIAL REPORT The figures have not been audited.

#### A1. CORPORATE INFORMATION

Malaysia Marine and Heavy Engineering Holdings Berhad is a public limited liability company incorporated and domiciled in Malaysia, and is listed on Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad.

These condensed consolidated interim financial statements were approved by the Board of Directors on 6 February 2017.

#### A2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

The condensed consolidated interim financial statements (Condensed Report) have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

These condensed consolidated interim financial statements, for the year ended 31 December 2016 have been prepared in accordance with MFRS 134 Interim Financial Reporting and paragraph 9.22 of the Listing Requirement of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad. These condensed consolidated interim financial statements also comply with IAS 34 Interim Financial Reporting issued by the International Accounting Standards Board.

The condensed report should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements for financial year ended 31 December 2015. The explanatory notes attached to these condensed consolidated interim financial statements provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the year ended 31 December 2015.

#### A3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial information presented herein has been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies to be used in preparing the annual consolidated financial statements for 31 December 2016 under the MFRS framework. These policies do not differ significantly from those used in the audited consolidated financial statements for 31 December 2015.

## A12. SUBSEQUENT MATERIAL EVENT

There was no material event subsequent to the current financial quarter to date.

#### A13. CHANGES IN THE COMPOSITION OF THE GROUP

MHB's wholly owned subsidiary, Malaysia Marine and Heavy Engineering Sdn. Bhd. ("MMHE") has, on 21 November 2016, acquired the remaining 30% holding in a subsidiary known as MMHE-SHI LNG Sdn. Bhd. ("MSLNG") from Samsung Heavy Industries Co. Ltd.

MSLNG was incorporated in Malaysia under the Companies Act on 6 April 2006 as a private limited company. MSLNG commenced business on 6 April 2006, with principal activity to provide repair services and drydocking of LNG carriers.

MSLNG has an authorised capital of RM11,100,000 divided into 3,000,000 ordinary shares of RM3.70 each and an issued and paidup share capital of RM3,700,000 comprising 1,000,000 ordinary shares of RM3.70 each. MSLNG has remained dormant throughout year 2016.

Subsequently, MSLNG has changed its name to MMHE LNG Sdn. Bhd. effective 8 December 2016.

## Performance of current quarter against the corresponding quarter

The Group registered lower operating profit of RM18.7 million against RM50.4 million in the corresponding quarter, which is segmentally analysed as follows:

#### **Heavy Engineering**

Heavy Engineering's revenue fell by 72% at the back of fewer and lower backlog and order intake; which in turn has resulted in operating loss of RM34.4 million compared to an operating profit of RM25.6 million.

### <u>Marine</u>

Marine's revenue and operating profit was higher against corresponding quarter mainly due to higher value of vessels repaired from LNG and FPSO conversion works in current quarter.

#### Group

The Group registered a higher loss before tax of RM126.6 million against RM49.8 million loss in the corresponding quarter in tandem with lower operating profit and higher impairment being recognised in current quarter.

#### Performance of current year against the corresponding year

The Group registered a lower operating profit at RM13.1 million against RM123.7 million in the corresponding year, which is analysed as follows:

## Heavy Engineering

Heavy Engineering registered lower revenue by 63% against previous year as a result of fewer and lower backlog and order intake.

An operating loss of RM107.7 million was recorded as compared to RM9.2 million profit in the corresponding year mainly due to insufficient revenue and contribution to absorb the Group's overhead.

#### **Marine**

Despite lower revenue against corresponding year, Marine's operating profit was higher at RM88.5 million compared to RM81.6 million in the corresponding year due to higher profit contributed by LNG and FPSO conversion works, which offers better margin compared to other categories.

#### <u>Group</u>

The Group registered a loss before tax of RM135.0 million against profit before tax of RM22.5 million in the corresponding year, mainly due to lower contribution from Heavy Engineering, net forex loss compared to gain in previous year as well as the impact from recognition of higher impairment on assets in current year.

In order to cope with the prolonged depressed outlook of the oil and gas industry, the Group continued its cost optimisation effort, including manpower rationalisation.

#### **B2. COMPARISON WITH PRECEDING QUARTER'S RESULTS**

The Group's registered a higher loss before taxation of RM126.6 million against the preceding quarter's loss before taxation of RM2.2 million. The variance was mainly due to recognition of impairment on assets amounting to RM140.5 million in current quarter.

#### **B3. CURRENT YEAR PROSPECTS**

Although an agreement was reached by OPEC and non-OPEC members to reduce their countries output from 1st January 2017, their commitment to honour this pact remains to be seen. NOCs and IOCs are expected to adopt the same strategy on deferment and scale-down of upstream projects for the major part of the year. Coupled with geopolitical risk, any meaningful recovery in the demand for offshore structures is not anticipated to materialise until 2018 at least.

The Group will continue with its efforts on cost management and resource optimisation to reduce its operating cost in line with the outlook of the industry. In addition, the Group intensifies its effort to replenish its orderbook, namely from onshore segment, hook-up & commissioning and facilities improvement.

#### B4. VARIANCE OF ACTUAL RESULTS COMPARED WITH FORECASTED AND SHORTFALL IN PROFIT GUARANTEE

The Company did not provide any profit forecast or profit guarantee in any public document.

During the year, the Group has recognised a net loss of RM6,917,000 in its statement of comprehensive income mainly due to settlement of the forward foreign currency contracts in the current year.
