PART A - EXPLANATORY NOTES PURSUANT TO MALAYSIAN FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS 134 ("MFRS 134")

A1. BASIS OF PREPARATION

The unaudited interim financial statements (Report) have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of MFRS 134: *Interim Financial Reporting* and paragraph 9.22 of the Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad for the Main Board. B1. OPERATING SEGMENTS REVIEW (CONT'D)

4Q14 vs. 4Q13 (cont'd)

The Group's revenue for the current quarter of RM12.4 million was 59% or RM18.0 million lower than the corresponding quarter last year of RM30.4 million. Lower revenue was mainly due to lower training conducted for Academy.

Other revenue is dividend income received from an operating subsidiary company which is eliminated at the group level.

The Group's PBT for the current quarter of RM1.8 million was lower by RM8.9 million or 83% as compared to RM10.7 million in the corresponding quarter last year.

YTD14 vs. YTD13

The Group's revenue for YTD14 was RM78.9 million, lower by RM40.5 million or 34% compared to RM119.4 million in YTD13. The revenue for YTD14 was lower mainly due to lower contribution for Software & Services and Academy segments.

Likewise, the Group's PBT recorded for YTD14 was RM20.4 million, lower by RM21.8 million or 52% lower from RM42.2 million recorded in YTD13. Lower PBT was mainly due to flow through from lower revenue contributed from Software & Services and Academy segments.

The Group's revenue for the current quarter of RM12.4 million was 27% or RM4.5 million lower than the preceding quarter of RM16.9 million. The lower number of training classes conducted by Academy segment contributed to overall decrease of the total revenue, mitigated by higher sales of software licenses by Software & Services.

The Group recorded lower PBT for the current quarter of RM1.8 million, 64% lower than the preceding quarter. The decrease in PBT was mainly due to flow through from overall lower revenue recorded as explained above.

B3. PROSPECTS

For the financial year ending 2015, the Group expects to remain positive. 2014 was an investment year where the Company invested RM4.5 million on strategic development of new projects. This investment includes bringing in top talents to enhance the competencies that will set a new platform for future sustainable growth, aligned to our new core focus as a talent and technology company.

B4. VARIANCE ON PROFIT FORECAST/PROFIT GUARANTEE

The Group did not issue any profit forecast or profit estimate previously in any public document.

This incentive has been extended for another 5 years to 29 June 2015.
