## PART A - EXPLANATORY NOTES PURSUANT TO MFRS 134 INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORTING

#### A1 BASIS OF PREPARATION

The interim financial statements have been prepared using historical cost basis except for certain financial assets and financial liabilities that are stated at fair value.

The interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with IAS 34 *Interim Financial Reporting*, MFRS 134 *Interim Financial Reporting* and paragraph 9.22 of the Main Market Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad.

The Interim Financial Statements are unaudited and should be read in conjunction with the Audited Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2015. The explanatory notes attached to the Interim Financial Statements provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to the understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the year ended 31 December 2015.

Within the context of these financial statements, the Group comprises the Company and its subsidiaries, and the Group's interest in its associates and its joint ventures as at and for the quarter ended 31 March 2016.

There was no qualified audit report issued by the auditors in the annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2015.

The Group's operations in relation to sales volume are not significantly affected by seasonal or cyclical fluctuations of the business/industry.

There were no exceptional items during the current quarter under review.

#### A5 MATERIAL CHANGES IN ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES

There were no material changes in estimates of the amounts reported in the most recent annual financial statements of the Group for the year ended 31 December 2015 that may have a material effect in the current quarter results.

Included in the trade and other receivables is an amount of RM89.9 million in respect of subsidy claims for diesel, which are pending approval from the Government Authorities.

The key assumption in estimating the recoverability of the amount was that there are letters received from the Government Authorities indicating that these claims will be reviewed and considered. All relevant documentations to support these claims have been submitted to the Government Authorities.

#### **B1** REVIEW OF PERFORMANCE

a) Performance of the current quarter against the corresponding quarter

Group Revenue for the quarter ended 31 March 2016 was RM4,929.4 million, a decrease of RM1,171.8 million over the results of the corresponding quarter last year mainly as a result of a decrease in average selling price by 20%. The decrease in average selling price was due to a decrease in Means of Platts Singapore ("MOPS") prices.

Group operating profit for the quarter ended 31 March 2016 was RM295.1 million, an increase of RM7.9 million compared to the corresponding quarter last year mainly as a result of higher other income by RM27.0 million and partially negated by lower gross profit of RM21.6 million. Higher other income was mainly due to accounting reclassification arising from Goods and Services Tax ("GST") implementation which has no profit impact as well as higher interest income.

#### Retail Segment

The decrease in revenue of RM333.9 million was mainly due to a decrease in selling prices by 12%, coupled with a decline in sales volume of Diesel in line with lower Retail industry demand.

The increase in operating profit by RM16.9 million compared to corresponding quarter last year was mainly due to higher other income by RM17.5 million, lower operating expenditure by RM5.7 million and partially negated by lower gross profit of RM6.3 million. Decrease in gross profit was mainly as a result of the decline in selling price, in line with the fall in MOPS.

#### Commercial Segment

The decrease in revenue by RM837.6 million was mainly due to a decrease in average selling price by 29%. Decrease in average selling price had mainly impacted revenue contribution for Diesel and Aviation.

The decrease in operating profit by RM8.9 million was mainly due to lower gross profit by RM15.0 million recorded mainly by Diesel, in line with lower demand from exploration and production, as well as fishery sectors. In addition, lower operating profit was also due to higher operating expenses by RM3.1 million, partially negated by higher other income by RM9.2 million.



### PART B – EXPLANATORY NOTES PURSUANT TO APPENDIX 9B OF MAIN MARKET LISTING REQUIREMENT OF BURSA MALAYSIA SECURITIES BERHAD

#### **B2 VARIATION OF RESULTS AGAINST PRECEDING QUARTER**

Group revenue for the quarter ended 31 March 2016 was RM4,929.4 million, a decrease of RM1,118.2 million compared to the preceding quarter mainly due to a decrease in average selling prices by 21%.

Group operating profit stood at RM295.1 million, an increase of RM164.5 million compared to the preceding quarter mainly due to lower operating expenditure by RM107.1 million and higher gross profit by RM64.2 million.

Lower operating expenditure was mainly attributable to lower repair and maintenance as well as lower manpower expenses in the current quarter following variation in yearly bonus payment. Higher gross profit was a result of increased sales volume in Retail and Commercial segments, and higher margins for Retail.

### **B3 CURRENT YEAR PROSPECTS**

Oil prices (Brent) dropped by 22% in Q1 2016 (USD34/bbl) compared to Q4 2015 (USD44/bbl). Global crude oil is expected to remain in oversupply situation resulting in continued oil price volatility.

Malaysia's GDP is expected to grow moderately between 4.0% - 4.5% this year compared to 5% in 2015.

Malaysia's Consumer Confidence Index (CCI)\* rose by 9.1 points to 72.9 in Q1 2016 from Q4 2015 (63.8 points) but it is still below threshold level of confidence. Consumers remain cautious in spending due to increasing cost of living which may potentially impact both fuel and non-fuel demand.

In terms of foreign exchange, the Malaysian Ringgit had strengthened by 2% against USD from Q4 2015 (USD1:RM4.29) to Q1 2016 (USD1:RM4.20).

The Directors are of the opinion that the economic and business environment outlook for FY2016 remains challenging. The Group will continue on inventory management, supply and distribution efficiency as well as operating expenditure optimisation to ensure the Company remains resilient in the face of a challenging environment.

## Retail Segment

Retail Segment will push for higher sales of petroleum products, leveraging on its superior products, namely PETRONAS PRIMAX 95 with Advanced Energy Formula and PETRONAS PRIMAX 97 Euro 4M with Advanced Energy Formula. Retail Segment will also focus on enhancing customer experience and services to meet customers' expectations.

#### Commercial Segment

Commercial Segment will emphasise on value by improving margins in targeted product and market segments, leveraging on the public and private sector investments on infrastructure and construction projects. In addition, the Commercial Segment will also leverage on its superior logistics, personalised services and differentiated offerings to sustain existing markets and capture new markets.

Foreign currency forward contracts are entered into by the Group in currencies other than the functional currency to manage exposure to the fluctuations in foreign currency exchange rates.

Foreign currency forward contracts are recognised on the contractual dates and are measured at fair value with changes in fair value recognised in profit or loss.

As at 31 March 2016, there were outstanding foreign currency forward contracts denominated in USD amounting to USD4.36 million.
