Higher revenue in the first quarter of 2018 ("1Q2018") was mainly contributed by higher selling prices, in line with the up-trend of international steel prices. The performance was further supported by higher domestic tonnage sold on gradual improvement in local demand from construction progress of various infrastructure and large-scale development projects.

1Q2018 PBT was lower than the corresponding quarter of preceding year ("1Q2017"), as the unusually high profit margin in 1Q2017 was the result of the surge in prices and lower carrying cost of inventory (referred to as a positive "price-cost effect").

15 PROSPECT

The Group remains optimistic about its business and industry outlook given the following fundamental drivers:

a. China's continued efforts on steel industry reform and robust domestic demand

China reaffirmed its pledge on steel industry reform with stringent environmental enforcement including the production suspension of steel mills which lack the required environmental protection facilities. China remains committed to stringent environmental controls and its focus towards quality production instead of quantity.

China's domestic demand is driven by steel-intensive infrastructure projects and continued property sector activity. The situation is further compounded this year due to pent-up demand after the winter restrictions on steel production and construction works.

b. Broad-based up-trend in global and regional steel demand

World steel demand is expected to remain resilient with a moderate growth rate, supported by global demand fundamentals, especially for long products which registered a strong recovery with 200 million mt consumption in the first quarter of 2018. The global construction sector is projected to grow an average of 3.7% per annum over the next five years, with spending of around USD12.4 trillion in 2022 (source: SBB Daily Briefing).

c. Expected robust domestic demand from construction activities

Domestic infrastructure activity, and resulting steel demand, was at a low base in 2016 and 2017. While near-term demand is affected by seasonal factors, the pace of construction activities of infra projects is expected to drive long-term domestic demand for construction steel and provide support to domestic steel prices.



15 PROSPECT (CONTINUED)

d. Impact of global graphite electrode supply tightness

A shortage of graphite electrode, a conductor of electricity for steel making, remains a threat to EAF and ladle furnace-based producers globally. The Group's hybrid operations, which combine the benefits and flexibility of our BF-EAF operations, result in a significantly lower electrode consumption in comparison with pure EAF producers. Ann Joo's strategic tie-up with suppliers via long-term contractual supply also assures adequate supply of electrode.

e. United States' Section 232 imposition on steel imports

The United States ("US") announced in March 2018 the imposition of a 25% tariff on steel imports under US Section 232. Given exemptions to various countries that export to the US, only approximately 12 million mt of steel exports to the US are actually affected by this tariff (source: US Census Bureau 2017 statistics).

The final impact of this measure to the global steel market is yet to be ascertained. However, as Ann Joo does not export to the US, there is no direct impact on our operations at this time.

The Group remains committed to continuous productivity improvement to drive its cost leadership in the construction steel sector. While long-term prospects are positive, the Group expects a seasonally lower second quarter of 2018 ("2Q18") due to seasonal factors that typically affect construction activity, including the Ramadan month and Raya holiday.

The Group is confident that the new government will put in place necessary measures to drive economic growth and efficient fiscal spending.

Given the fundamental drivers above, and continued enhancements in operating efficiency, the Group's performance is expected to remain satisfactory in the remaining period of 2018.

21 MATERIAL LITIGATIONS

21.1 In the Matter of an Arbitration Between Ann Joo Integrated Steel Sdn. Bhd. ("AJIS") (Claimant) and Tangshan Iron & Steel International Engineering Technology Co. Ltd ("Tangshan") (Respondent)

AJIS, a wholly-owned subsidiary had on 18 August 2016 filed a claim in arbitration against Tangshan for, inter alia:

- (i) USD10,200,000 as liquidated ascertained damages on account of Tangshan's delay in completing the works as per the Contract;
- (ii) USD5,470,533 for various breaches and/or non-performance of the Contract by Tangshan; and
- (iii) USD1,250,000 for the refund of excess or mistaken payment.

Tangshan has on 20 October 2016 filed their statement of Defense and Counterclaim for the sum of USD43,341,733 and RMB8,757,617 based on various claims under the Contract and disputes that have arisen from the execution of the project. AJIS filed its Reply and Defence to Counterclaim on 15 December 2016 and the Respondent filed their Reply to Defence to Counterclaim on 30 January 2017.

The arbitration hearing was held in October 2017. Pursuant to the Tribunal's directions, both parties filed and exchanged their respective Written Submissions on 23 November 2017 and both parties subsequently filed and exchanged their respective Written Submission in Reply on 14 December 2017.

The Tribunal had estimated in October 2017 that the arbitration award would be delivered in March 2018. On 17 April 2018, the Tribunal informed both parties that the Tribunal would need more time to deliberate due to multiple and complex issues of law and fact in the case and that the Tribunal will try its best to deliver the award within 2 months from 17 April 2018.

The solicitors in-charge are of the view that there is a better than even chance that the award will result in a net payment to AJIS.

21.2 In the High Court of Malaya at Pulau Pinang Civil Suit No: 22-274-2010 Between Ann Joo Steel Berhad ("AJSB") (Plaintiff) And Tenaga Nasional Berhad & 2 Others (Defendant)

AJSB, a wholly-owned subsidiary, had filed a suit against the Defendants for trespass on Lot No. 78, Seberang Perai Tengah, Bandar Prai, Pulau Pinang ("the Land") registered in the name of AJSB.

On 22 August 2016, the High Court had delivered a decision in favour of AJSB and the Defendants had filed Notices of Appeal against the High Court Decision. On 24 July 2017, the Court of Appeal overturned the High Court decision of which the Ground Judgment of the Court of Appeal was obtained on 21 September 2017.

21.2 In the High Court of Malaya at Pulau Pinang Civil Suit No: 22-274-2010 Between Ann Joo Steel Berhad ("AJSB") (Plaintiff) And Tenaga Nasional Berhad & 2 Others (Defendant) (continued)

AJSB has on 23 August 2017 filed its applications for leave to appeal to the Federal Court against the Court of Appeal's Orders. On the date of hearing on 22 January 2018, the Federal Court has allowed AJSB's application for leave to appeal and pursuant thereto, AJSB has filed the Notices of Appeal on 26 January 2018.

The hearing date for AJSB's appeals has been fixed on 30 August 2018 and both parties are to file the Written Submission by 16 August 2018.

The solicitors in-charge are of the opinion that there is an even chance of success in the appeal.

21.3 Statement of claim against Ann Joo Steel Berhad Suit No.: WA-22NCvC-303-06/2017

AJSB has on 21 June 2017 received a Written Statement of Claim filed by the solicitors of Amsteel alleging wrongful termination of the supply Contract and Addendum by AJSB.

AJSB's solicitors entered appearance in Court on 30 June 2017 and AJSB had accordingly attended to the filing and service of the Defence on 24 July 2017. Amsteel filed an application to amend the Statement of Claim and the Judge had allowed Amsteel's application on 26 September 2017. As such, the damages for loss of profits incurred which would otherwise have been made from the sales of Rebar and Wire Rod using the billet that were ordered is now claimed in the sum of RM14,869,865. Also, damages being the difference between the price of the Rebar billet in the Contract and Addendum, and the market price of Rebar billet at the latest date of delivery, in the alternative, is now claimed for the sum of RM1,449,200. The remaining prayers within Amsteel's Statement of Claim remain unchanged.

Amsteel has disclosed their list of witnesses including their expert witness to the court. AJSB has filed the summary of case in Court and also served a copy on Amsteel. Both parties have been directed by the Court to file the bundle of documents including Amsteel's expert report. During the case management held on 14 May 2017, both parties have yet to file the bundle of documents and Amsteel have informed the Court that their expert has not completed the expert report for this matter. Amsteel also informed the Court that they have filed and served an application to amend their pleading although we have yet to receive the same. Therefore, both parties have been directed to update the Court on the status of pre-trial cause papers i.e. the bundle of documents and the Amsteel's expert report as well as directed AJSB to file Affidavit in Reply (if any) by next case management to be held on 5 June 2018.

Meanwhile, the trial dates on 16 to 20 July 2018 has been vacated and rescheduled to 24 and 25 September 2018, 15 October 2018 and 18 October 2018.

No opinion could be formed as it is too early to inform what would be the likely outcome of the matter.

Save as disclosed above, there were no other material litigations against the Group as at the date of this report.
