Notes To The Interim Financial Statements For The Period Ended 31 December 2010

1. Basis of preparation

The interim financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 134, Interim Financial Reporting and paragraph 9.22 of the Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad.

The interim financial statements should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements of the Group for the year ended 31 March 2010. These explanatory notes attached to the interim financial statements provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the year ended 31 March 2010.

(i) Sukuk Musyarakah Medium Term Notes (IMTNs)

Prior to the adoption of FRS 139, the IMTNs were initially stated at cost, being the fair value of the consideration received. After initial recognition, the difference between the fair value and the nominal value are recognised as an expense and accreted to the principal at a constant charge per annum up to the maturity of each series. With the adoption of FRS 139, the difference between the fair value and the nominal value is measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method based on the appropriate interest rate at inception. The difference between the remeasured amount arising from the adoption of FRS 139 and the carrying amount as at 31 March 2010 has been accounted for by adjusting the opening balance of retained earnings as at 1 April 2010.

(ii) Bank Guaranteed Serial Fixed Rate Bonds ("BG Bonds")

Prior to the adoption of FRS 139, the BG Bonds were initially stated at cost, being the fair value of the consideration received. The fixed coupon rate ranges from 4.00% to 10.35% per annum. With the adoption of FRS 139, the difference between the fair value and the nominal value is measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method based on the appropriate interest rate at inception. The difference between the remeasured amount arising from the adoption of FRS 139 and the carrying amount as at 31 March 2010 has been accounted for by adjusting the opening balance of retained earnings as at 1 April 2010.

(iii) Al-Bai Bithaman Ajil Islamic Debts Securities Issuance Facility ("Restructured BaIDS")

Prior to the adoption of FRS 139, the Restructured BaIDS were initially stated at cost, being the fair value of the consideration received. After initial recognition, the difference between the fair value and the nominal value are recognised as an expense and accreted to the principal at a constant charge per annum up to maturity. The coupon rate ranges from 3.00% to 6.30% per annum. With the adoption of FRS 139, the difference between the fair value and the nominal value is measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method based on the appropriate interest rate at inception. The difference between the remeasured amount arising from the adoption of FRS 139 and the carrying amount as at 31 March 2010 has been accounted for by adjusting the opening balance of retained earnings as at 1 April 2010.

3. Audit report of preceding annual financial statements

There was no qualification in the audit report of the financial statements of the Group for the year ended 31 March 2010.

4. Seasonality and cyclicality of operations

There was no significant fluctuation in the seasonality or cyclicality of operations affecting the Group.

5. Unusual items due to their nature, size or incidence

There were no unusual items affecting assets, liabilities, equity, net income, or cash flows for the current quarter and financial year-to-date.

6. Changes in estimates

There were no changes in estimates of amounts reported in prior financial years that have a material effect in the current quarter and financial year-to-date.

7. Debt and equity securities

There were no issuance, cancellations, repurchases, resale and repayments of debt and equity securities for the current financial year-to-date except for the issuance of 2,633,000 new ordinary shares of RM0.20 each for cash pursuant to the Company's ESOS at exercise price ranging between RM1.42 and RM3.05 per ordinary share.

8. Dividends paid

During the year, the Group paid a single tier interim dividend of 10 sen per share in respect of ordinary shares for financial year ending 31 March 2011 amounting to RM50,169,061.80 on 27 September 2010.

(a) On 1 April 2010, the Company entered into Sale of Shares Agreements with Sistem Penyuraian Trafik KL Barat Holdings Sdn Bhd and Kesas Holdings Berhad to acquire the balance of shares in ETC Links Sdn Bhd ("ETC Links") not already owned by the Company totalling 400,002 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each and representing 66.67% of the issued and paid-up capital of ETC Links, for a total cash consideration of RM260,344 ("the Acquisition"). Upon the Acquisition, ETC Links which was an associate company, became a whollyowned subsidiary of the Company.

12. Changes in composition of the Group (Cont'd)

(b) Semarak Zaman Sdn Bhd, a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company, had been struck off from the Register of Companies Commission of Malaysia and dissolved with effect from 4 April 2010. Semarak Zaman Sdn Bhd has not commenced operation since its incorporation.

The above is part of rationalisation and streamlining exercise and not expected to have any material impact on the Group and the Company.

22. Material litigations

There were no pending material litigations. There has been no change in the situation since 31 March 2010 to a date not earlier than 7 days from the date of issue of this announcement.

23. Comparison of profit before taxation with the immediate preceding quarter

The Group's profit before taxation for the current quarter of RM37.5 million is slightly lower than the Group's profit before taxation of RM38.3 million achieved in the immediate preceding quarter. This is mainly due to higher operating expenses in the current quarter.

24. Review of performance for the current quarter

For the current quarter, the Group recorded a higher revenue of RM78.7 million as compared to RM77.3 million recorded in the immediate preceding quarter and RM78.5 million recorded in the preceding year corresponding quarter. The higher revenue in the current quarter as compared to the immediate preceding quarter is mainly due to the effect of higher traffic volume.

25. Current year's prospects

In April 2009, the Government had announced that it will come out with a long term solution to the recurring public pressure it faces with respect to toll increases and had instructed the Economic Planning Unit to come out with recommendations. The decision from the Government is still being awaited. According to the Concession Agreement, the next toll increase is on 1 January 2011 but the Government has decided that the toll rate increase to be deferred until further notice. Based on our past negotiations with the Government, the Group is, however, optimistic that terms of the Concession Agreement will be observed by all parties concerned.

Barring any unforeseen circumstances, particularly significant increase in fuel prices, the Board of Directors is optimistic that a low but gradual increase in revenue will be generated from the projected growth in traffic plying the Lebuh Raya Damansara-Puchong ("LDP").

26. Profit forecast or profit guarantees

27. Dividend

On 25 February 2011, the Board of Directors has approved a second single tier interim dividend of 7 sen per share for the financial year ending 31 March 2011.

The second interim dividend shall be paid at a date to be determined and in respect of deposited securities, entitlement to dividend will be determined on the basis of the record of depositors at the book closure date.

The Board of Directors had approved a second single tier interim dividend of 7 sen per share for the financial year ending 31 March 2010 in the previous year corresponding quarter ended 31 December 2009.

The total dividend per share for the current financial year-to-date is 17 sen inclusive of the first single tier interim dividend of 10 sen, paid on 27 September 2010. For the preceding year corresponding period, a total single tier interim dividend per share of 17 sen was declared.

28. Earnings per share

The basic earnings per share is calculated based on the Group's profit for the period from continuing operations, net of tax, attributable to owners of the parent of RM82.890 million and weighted average number of ordinary shares outstanding during the period of 501.253 million.

The diluted earnings per share is calculated based on the Group's profit for the period from continuing operations, net of tax, attributable to owners of the parent of RM82.890 million and weighted average number of ordinary shares outstanding during the period including dilutive potential shares, of 501.734 million calculated as follows:
