# NOTES TO THE INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE QUARTER ENDED 31st DECEMBER 2009

#### A1. Basis of Preparation

The interim financial report has been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The interim financial statements are unaudited and have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of FRS 134: Interim Financial Reporting and paragraph 9.22 of the Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad. The accounting policies and methods of computation adopted by the Group in this report are consistent with those adopted in the financial statements for the period ended 31 March 2009 with the exception for FRS 139, whereby unrealised gains on quoted investments are not recognised in the financial statements until year end. Unrealised losses on quoted investments are recognised immediately whilst unrealised gains will only be recognised at the year end.

This interim financial report should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements of the Group for the period ended 31 March 2009.

#### A2. Audit Report of Preceding Annual Financial Statements

The financial statements for the period ended 31 March 2009 were unqualified.

## A3. Seasonal or Cyclical Factors

The business operations of the Group have been significantly affected by the present slump in the shipping industry coupled with the extremely difficult funding situation faced by the Company. Further explanations are provided in table B2.

#### A4. Nature and Amounts of Unusual Items

There were no items affecting assets, liabilities, equity, net income or cash flows that are unusual because of their nature, size, or incidence for the current quarter.

#### A5. Changes in Estimates

There were no changes to the estimates of amounts reported in prior financial years that may have a material effect in the current quarter.

#### A9. Valuation of Ships, Property and Equipment

The fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

#### A10. Subsequent Material Events

On 4 February 2010, Malaysian Rating Corporation Berhad downgraded the Company's Al Bai' Bithamin Ajil Islamic Debt Securities (BaIDS) to BB+id from A-id. This downgrade may trigger an event of default in terms of the Company's borrowings as it is a condition in the loans (taken in 2111) that the Company's BaIDS should be rated no lower than BBB.

In anticipation of this downgrade, the Company had commenced discussions with its main lenders to seek their consent for the Company's new lending for its new vessels on order. An announcement was made by the Company on 4 February 2010 highlighting the implications of this downgrade in details. These discussions are ongoing as of this date.

The Board remains hopeful that its lender will acquiesce to the Company's request.

# A13. Capital Commitments

During the previous financial period, the Company committed to purchase a vessel for an amount of USD 41.5 million of which a deposit of USD 3.11 million was paid. This deposit was paid as there was confirmation of receipt of funding from a consortium of funders, mainly based in the Middle East but led by a Malaysian financial institution ("MFI"). However, given the financial upheaval in the Middle East coupled with the uncertainties of the world economy, the consortium of funders failed to deliver on the commitment and the Company has taken legal action against the MFI. This matter is still pending.

Due to the continuing weak market condition and tight credit situation, other similar vessel orders were also either delayed or cancelled. The implications of these actions by the Board, if any, will be announced when ascertained.

In the meantime, the Board is pleased to announce that the Company has already obtained funding of US\$ 77 million ("Project Acid") from another financial institution ("AFI") to fund the purchase of the vessels to service a long term contract. However, the treatment of the deposit paid earlier on cancelled deals, is still under discussion with the various parties concerned. When the discussions are finally completed, an appropriate announcement shall be made, if required.

As mentioned in paragraph A10, the disbursement of funds for Project Acid by the AFI is subject to approval from the main lenders of the Company.

## B2. Prospects for the Current Financial Period

At the 14th Annual General Meeting ("AGM") on 31st December 2007, the Board described several initiatives to revamp the Company's financial status. In that AGM briefing, the Board explained that one of the initiatives was the capital reorganization of the Company to reflect a Balance Sheet that is more acceptable to the lending and investing community, and to enhance shareholder value. Towards this, the Board had commissioned external consultants to review the capital structure and make the necessary recommendations to the Board. Following that exercise, the Board announced its intention to undertake a capital reduction of its issued and paid-up share capital via the cancellation of RM0.65 of the par value of each existing ordinary shares of RM1.00 each and irredeemable non-convertible Islamic preference shares of RM1.00 each ('Proposed Par Value Reduction') on 19 January 2009. The capital reorganization proposal was expected to contribute positively to the Company's efforts to obtain new funding as the revised Balance Sheet, post capital reorganization, is expected to eliminate substantially the brought forward losses and to make the Balance Sheet neater. However, this proposal was not approved by the shareholders at the Extraordinary General Meeting held on 22 May 2009. As a result, the Company's efforts to raise new funding continues to be significantly impacted negatively. It is imperative that the Company's capital structure is reorganized and shored up to meet the challenges of the year ahead. At an appropriate time, an announcement will be made in respect of this matter.

The Company's fleet disposal plan has also faced some setback in that the buyer(s) of our vessels too are having similar funding difficulty. However, the sale of the Company's double hull tanker, MMM

Ashton, is still progressing although the process of finalisation has taken a time much longer than originally anticipated.

Cognizant of the fact that the Group's revenue base needs to be expanded to cater for the demanding operating environment, the management is looking at other synergistic areas. One prospect is the oil and gas sector. The Group has made an announcement on 16 November 2009 to participate in an oil producing field with reserves up to 11 million barrels. However on 12 January 2010, the Board had received news that the Company was not successful in its bid for the said project.

The Board is in continuous discussions with several parties on other investment / divestment opportunities. As and when any firm invitation to participate is obtained, it is the Board's practice to make an appropriate announcement.

Given that the Board's recommendation for a capital reorganization to facilitate funding was not approved by the shareholders, and with the ongoing difficulties in this industry as explained above, the Directors remain cautious for the financial year ahead.

#### **B3.** Variance of Profit and Forecast Profit Guarantee

There were no profit forecast or profit guarantee for the period under review.

#### **B4.** Taxation

The income of the Group derived from the operations of sea-going Malaysian registered ships is tax exempt under Section 54A of the Income Tax, 1967.
