Notes:-

- (a) The increase in turnover and operating profit in 1996 was due to the incorporation of the full year's operation of ABSarawak and the turnover of ABSawmill's log extraction and trading activities. In the same year, the sales to Japan had increased by RM9.3 million due to higher demand of moulding timber.
- (b) Increased production of moulding timber in ABSabah contributed to the improved turnover for 1997. The export sales to Middle East had increased from RM5.5 million in 1996 to RM9 million in 1997 due to higher demand for certain mixed wood species. The sales to Japan, Hong Kong & China and Europe increased further in 1998 due mainly to higher demand for moulding timber from these countries.
- (c) The decrease in the operating profit for the sale of sawn timber in 1998 was due to the higher cost of sales for purchased sawn timbers. The increase in production and sale of moulding timber had increased the overall operating profit in 1997 and 1998.
- (d) Increased trading of sawn and moulding timber contributed to the turnover increase in 1999. Increase in sales to Japan in 1999 was due mainly to higher demand of moulding timber and sawn timber from this country. Turnover for the first nine months of 2000 increased compared to the pro-rated turnover in the previous year due mainly to the increase in sales of sawn timber and timber logs. The sales to Europe for the nine months ended 30th September 2000 had increased due to the Group's increased efforts in exporting to this region. In addition, the certification by an independent assessor of the Group's (through ABSawmill) compliance to sustainable forest management requirements has enable the Group to increase its exports to countries in this region which are strong advocates for environmental lobbying. In the same period, the exports to Japan had decreased due to lower demand of moulding timber from this country.
- (e) Operating profit for the nine months ended 30th September 2000 decreased marginally when compared to the pro-rated profit achieved in 1999 due mainly to a drop in gross profit margin for the sale of sawn timber.

Aikbee and ABSawmill have not declared and paid any dividends since its incorporation.

10 NOTES TO THE PROFORMA STATEMENT OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES

10.1 BASIS OF PRESENTATION

The proforma group statement has been prepared solely to illustrate the financial position of the Group had the acquisition of the entire issued and paid-up capital of ABSabah, ABSarawak and ABSawmill by Aikbee in exchange for shares in Aikbee, and the subsequent Rights Issue and Public Issue and utilisation of proceeds from shares issued have been effected as at 30th September 2000.

10.2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

All significant accounting policies set out below are consistent with those normally adopted by Aikbee Group.

(a) Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Group and the Company have been prepared under the historical cost convention modified by the revaluation of land and buildings and comply with applicable approved Accounting Standards of the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board ("MASB").

(b) Basis of Consolidation

The proforma Group financial statements incorporate the financial statements of the Company and all its subsidiary companies made up to the end of the financial period. All the subsidiary companies are consolidated based on the acquisition method of accounting.

The difference between the cost of investments and the fair value of the net assets of the subsidiary companies acquired is included in the consolidated financial statements as goodwill or reserve arising on consolidation, where appropriate.

All inter-company transactions are eliminated on consolidation and the consolidated accounts reflect external transactions only.

(c) Investments

Investments in subsidiary companies and other investments are stated at cost and are only written down when the directors consider that there is a permanent diminution in the value of the investments.



(d) Property, Plant and Equipment

Land and buildings are stated at valuation except for building constructed on land held under Temporary Occupation Licence. The cost of other property, plant and equipment comprises their purchase cost and any incidental costs of acquisition.

Freehold land is not depreciated. Leasehold land is amortised over the period of the lease. Depreciation of other property, plant and equipment is calculated so as to write off their cost or valuation on a straight line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets concerned.

The principal annual rates used are :-

Buildings	2% - 10%
Plant and machinery	10% - 20%
Motor vehicles	20%
Office equipment	10% - 20%
Furniture and fittings	5% - 20%
Electrical installation	7.5%
Jetty	2%

Revaluation of land and buildings is undertaken every 5 years. Surplus arising from revaluation is credited directly to revaluation reserve. Deficit in excess of the revaluation reserve arising from previous revaluation is charged to the income statement.

(e) Inventory

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value and cost is calculated using the weighted average method or the specific identification method.

The cost components in respect of the various categories of inventories are as follows:-

Raw materials

- Cost of logs purchases and transportation.

Finished goods and work-in-progress

- Direct materials, direct labour, and attributable production overheads.



(f) Deferred Taxation

Provision is made using the liability method for taxation which is deferred due to timing differences except where such differences are not expected to reverse in the foreseeable future. Where timing differences result in a debit balance, this is recognised only where there is a reasonable certainty of realisation.

(g) Hire Purchase

Assets acquired under hire purchase arrangement are capitalised as property, plant and equipment based on the principal sum of the hire purchase and the corresponding obligations are taken up as hire purchase creditor.

The interest element is charged to Income Statement over the period of the respective arrangement.

(h) Planting Expenditure

Planting expenditure comprises cost of clearing, preparing the ground, cost of additional roads, bridges and seeding in relation to establishing a new rootstock.

The expenditure is capitalised and will be amortised over the useful life of the rootstock upon its maturity.

(i) Foreign Currencies Transactions

Foreign currencies transactions have been converted into Ringgit Malaysia at the rates of exchange ruling at the dates of the transactions. Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies at balance sheet date have been converted into Ringgit Malaysia at the rates of exchange ruling at that date. Gains or losses resulting from the year's operations are dealt with through the income statement.
