The revenue for the group has decreased by RM14,419,000 or 21.86% to RM51,547,000 from RM65,966,000 mainly due to a special project undertaken by the Central Region amounting to RM8,451,245 of which RM4,901,722 was accounted for in the period ended 30.6.2018 and RM211,281 was accounted for in the period ended 30.6.2019,sales to Valcona Oil Tanks by Singapore Region amounting to RM12,000 for the quarter ended 30/6/2019 as compared to RM2,633,000 for the period ended 30/6/2018 and overall weak market conditions.

The profit before tax has decreased by RM3,577,000 or 55.49% to RM2,869,000 from RM6,446,000 mainly due to decrease in revenue as mentioned above.

The revenue for the group has decreased by RM6,763,000 or 30.12% to RM15,690,000 from RM22,453,000 mainly due to a special project undertaken by the Central Region amounting to RM8,451,245 of which RM1,690,249 was accounted for in the period ended 30.6.2018 and RM0 was accounted for in the period ended 30.6.2019,sales to Valcona Oil Tanks by Singapore Region amounting to RM0 for the quarter ended 30/6/2019 as compared to RM979,000 for the period ended 30/6/2018 and overall weak market conditions.

The profit before tax has decreased by RM1,966,000 or 60.44% to RM1,287,000 from RM3,253,000 mainly due to decrease in revenue as mentioned above.

The group's performance for the quarter under review against the preceding quarter of the year is as follows:-

The revenue for the group has decreased by RM2,213,000 or 12.36% to RM15,690,000 from RM17,903,000(As per table below). This decreased was mainly contributed by the overall weak market conditions.

The profit before tax has increase by RM120,000 or 10.28% to RM1,287,000 from RM1,167,000 mainly due to decrease in operating expenses.

The main contributor to the decrease in revenue by segment is from the Central Region due to the reason as mentioned above.

B3. Current financial year's prospects

According to the IMF the global economy grew moderately during the second quarter of 2019.

In the advanced economies, the US GDP growth moderated to 2.3 % after peaking in the first half of 2018 and slowing down due to weaker investment activity.

During this quarter, the Eurozone GDP growth of 1.1 % was its weakest since 2013 attributable to softer consumption demand and contracted industrial production especially in the automotive sector and a lackluster global trade performance. Growth in the UK was down to 1.2 % as a result of slower industrial production and private consumption as well as the looming BREXIT issue with the EU.

Moving to Asia, growth in PR China moderated to 6.2% in the second quarter of 2019 as China continues to implement measures to rebalance its economy in the wake of its ongoing trade war with the US. The rest of the Asian economies comprising Korea, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Malaysia, Indonesia, Thailand and Singapore encountered contracted exports as a result of weaker external demand resulting from the tit for tat trade war between US and China. Any signs of immediate resolution seems remote for the coming quarters going forward.

In ASEAN 4 (Malaysia, Thailand, Indonesia and Philippines), domestic demands drove the economy of its member country augmented by strong employment and infrastructural spending especially in Thailand and Philippines.

During the current quarter, the Malaysian economy grew by 4.9% (1Q2019:4.5 %) underpinned by continued expansion in domestic demands and renewed export of palm oil to PR China.

Domestic demands grew by 4.6% in the second quarter owing to household and consumer spending and moderately higher private investment.

Private consumption grew to 7.8 % from 7.6% in the first quarter driven by continued income growth and the festive spending during this period.

Public consumption declined from 6.3% in the first quarter to 0.3 % in the second quarter due to lower expenditures on supplies and services.

On the supply side, there was expansion across the spectrum of the Malaysian economy.

The services sector grew by 6.1% in this quarter albeit lower than 6.4% in 1Q2019. This was achieved by a sustained growth in the subsectors of wholesale, retail, automotive and household consumer spending. The transport and storage subsector was powered by higher air passenger traffic and port activity. For the information and communication subsector, a slower demand for data communication services resulted in a moderated growth for this subsector.

The manufacturing sector in 2Q2019 grew marginally at 4.3% (1Q2019:4.2%) due to better performance by its domestic oriented industries such as the higher output of motor vehicles resulting from stronger demand during the festive season. Higher demand for metal based products for ongoing transport and infrastructural projects also contributed to this industrial growth.

For the export oriented sector of the Malaysian economy, the production of electronic and electrical parts continued to be impacted by the current reconfiguration of the global supply chain due to the ongoing trade war between US and China.

The mining sector rebounded in the second quarter to 2.1% (-2.1%:1Q2019). This upturn is mainly attributable to the increase in recovery of natural gas output following pipeline disruptions in 2018.

This increase more than compensated for the shortfall in lower crude oil production owing to planned facilities shutdown.

The construction sector grew marginally higher at 0.5% (1Q2019:0.3%) amidst weak activity in residential homes and a high number of unsold commercial properties.

A slowdown or delay of Government infrastructural projects like the ECRL, LRT3 also contributed to a lackluster performance.

In the agriculture sector, growth was lower at 4.2% (1Q2019:5.6%) due to a decline in output of fishing and forestry, and rubber industry. However this decline was partially offset by an increase in oil palm yield after recovering from adverse effects of the El Nino weather.

The macroeconomic outlook for 2019 global growth is expected to moderate to around 3.2% (2018:3.6%) according to the IMF global forecast.

For the advanced economies, collectively the GDP growth for 2019 is forecasted to drop to 1.9% against 2.2% for 2018. The GDP growth in the US is expected to taper downwards to 2.6% in 2019 (2018:2.8%) due to the slowing of investment activity, a waning supportive fiscal measures and the continuing uncertainties arising from the worsening of the trade war with PR China.

The Eurozone growth is projected at 1.3% for 2019 and will be adversely impacted by moderately weak exports and domestic consumption.

Likewise, the emerging market economies will also be affected and growth will moderate to 4.1% for 2019 from 4.5% in 2018. The economic performance for the Asian region is also expected to slow down owing to weaker exports.

In PR China, the negative effects of an escalating trade war and a reduced global demand is expected to dampen its economic growth for 2019 to 6.2% by IMF estimates. This growth will be supported and driven by the government's stimulus measures to its domestic economy.

The general outlook and mood for 2019 and beyond will be on the downside; owing to the expectation of an escalating trade war between US and PR China, as well as uncertainties from Brexit negotiations and financial markets volatility.

According to Bank Negara Malaysia, the Malaysian economy is expected to improve; underpinned by the recovery of our commodity exports primarily of palm oil. This recovery is expected to follow through into the second half of 2019 but risked being affected by slower global growth and the ongoing trade conflicts between US and PR China.

Growth in the Malaysian economy is forecasted to remain within 4.3%-4.8% in 2019. It is expected that private sector initiatives will stimulate and drive this growth. Domestic household spending and consumption will be propelled by a stable employment market as well as increased investment in capex in vital sectors such as manufacturing and services. The outlook of Malaysian economy and its GDP growth forecast of 4.3%-4.8% are nonetheless subjected to the various risk factors as identified below:

- 1 .The escalation of trade disputes between US and PR China spilling into 2020 and beyond with no resolution in sight, and the anxiety that these disputes may be expanded into other issues like currency, technology and geopolitics. This possibly may trigger contagion effects across the global economy.
- 2. Crude oil prices remaining within USD60-70 will enable the government to implement its programs provided for in the 2019 Malaysian budget.
- 3. Financial and market volatility in advanced and emerging economies will unsettle currency and capital flows.
- 4. Geopolitical tensions erupting in hotspots across the globe will have disrupting repercussions to global peace, stability and prosperity.
- 5. Adverse global climate changes and other natural disasters affecting food and crop production.
- 6. The ability by the government to contain our national debt situation and restart suspended planned infrastructural projects like the ECRL on acceptable revised costs and terms.
- 7. Continuation of efforts by the government to curb inflation via price control of essential necessities and the implementation of minimum wage policy to stimulate consumer spending.

Going forward the Board is cautiously optimistic of achieving a profitable outcome for the financial year 2019.
