Investments in equity instruments are always measured at fair value through profit or loss with an irrevocable option at inception to present changes in fair value in OCI (provided the instrument is not held for trading).

A2) Significant Accounting Policies (Cont'd)

A debt instrument is measured at amortised cost only if the entity is holding it to collect contractual cash flows and the cash flows represent principal and interest.

For liabilities, the standard retains most of the MFRS 139 requirements. These include amortised cost accounting for most financial liabilities, with bifurcation of embedded derivatives. The main change is that, in cases where the fair value option is taken for financial liabilities, the part of a fair value change due to an entity's own credit risk is recorded in OCI rather than the profit or loss, unless this creates an accounting mismatch.

MFRS 9 introduces an expected credit losses model on impairment that replaces the incurred loss impairment model used in MFRS 139. The expected credit losses model is forward-looking and eliminates the need for a trigger event to have occurred before credit losses are recognised.

The Company are currently still in process of assessing the impact of the new standards upon initial application of these standards.

• MFRS 15, Revenue from Contracts with Customers

MFRS 15 replaces MFRS 118 Revenue, MFRS 111 Construction Contracts and related IC Interpretations. The Standard deals with revenue recognition and establishes principles for reporting useful information to users of financial statements about the nature, amount, timing and uncertainty of revenue and cash flows arising from an entity's contracts with customers.

Revenue is recognised when a customer obtains control of a good or service and thus has the ability to direct the use and obtain the benefits from the good or service. The core principle in MFRS 15 is that an entity recognises revenue to depict the transfer of promised goods or services to the customers in an amount that reflects the consideration to which the entity expects to be entitled in exchange for those goods or services.

The directors expect that the adoption of the above standards will have no material impact on the financial statements for the current quarter.

Comparison with corresponding period in the previous year

The Group's revenue for the current period under review was RM19.53 million and loss before tax was RM1.90 million.

The revenue was increased to RM19.53 million, increased by 155.86% or RM11.90 million to higher than RM7.63 million in preceding year corresponding period under review. The revenue in current period consists of 9 months revenue derived in year 2018 as compared to only 5 month revenue derived in preceding year corresponding after resumes operation in 2 quarter of year 2017.

The Group had turned its financial position from a gross loss of RM1.18 million in the preceding year corresponding period under review into a gross profit position of RM4.25 million, increased by 460.70% in current period. The improvement in gross profit resulting from the Group had consistently increased its business revenue from its business activities and the revenue derived was excessive to cover its cost of sales.

The Group gains an operating profit of RM0.45 million in the current period as compared to operating loss of RM0.95 million in the preceding year corresponding period under review, increased by 147.32%. The Group received other income in sum of RM0.30 million including rental income of RM0.18 million, commission received of RM0.02 million, insurance recovery of RM0.03 million, reversal of impairment loss on trade receivables of RM0.03 million and miscellaneous and scrap sales of RM0.04 million.

PART B: EXPLANATORY NOTES PURSUANT TO PART A OF APPENDIX 9B OF THE LISTING REQUIREMENTS OF BURSA MALAYSIA SECURITIES BERHAD

B1) Review of Group Performance (Continued)

The Group suffered a loss before tax of RM1.90 million, 50.79% lower than RM3.87 million in the preceding year corresponding period under review. This loss before tax of RM1.90 million arose after deducting the finance cost, i.e. term loan interest and finance lease interest of RM2.35 million.

For West Malaysia, its revenue increased by RM10.31 million to RM16.85 million or represented 157.62% higher as compared to RM6.54 million in the preceding year corresponding period under review. For East Malaysia, the revenue increased to RM2.68 million, increased by RM1.59 million or represented 145.29% increase as compared with RM1.09 million in the preceding year corresponding period under review. The Group had managed to increase and maintain its revenue average RM2.17 million per month in year 2018.

West Malaysia had suffered a lower loss before tax of RM1.36 million for current period under review as compared to loss before tax of RM4.00 million in the preceding year corresponding period under review, improved by RM 2.64 million or 66.03%. In current period, the Group did not incurred significant impairment loss on property, plant and equipment or written off of property, plant and equipment except loss on disposal of property, plant and equipment of RM0.05 million as compared to preceding year corresponding period under review.

East Malaysia also suffered a loss before tax of RM0.54 million as compared to profit before tax of RM0.13 million in preceding year corresponding period under review resulting from the increase in salary paid and transport charges in line with the increase in revenue. Besides, East Malaysia did not received any one off income, i.e. insurance compensation as compared to insurance compensation on damage of factory due to fire of RM0.77 million received in preceding year corresponding period under review.

Comparison with preceding quarter

The Group's revenue for the current quarter under review was RM6.47 million and loss before tax was RM0.55 million.

The Group's revenue for the quarter under review was RM6.47 million as compared to RM6.79 million in the immediate preceding quarter under review, decreased by RM0.32 million or 4.67%. Revenue drops by RM 0.32 million due to reduce in demand from customer resulting from reducing selling price from competitor in market.

For West Malaysia, total revenue decreased by 4.97% or RM0.29 million to RM5.58 million as compared to RM5.87 million in the preceding quarter. For East Malaysia, revenue also decreased by RM0.03 million or 2.72% to RM0.89 million as compared to RM0.92 million in the preceding quarter.

There were no significant changes in gross profit for current year quarter and the immediate preceding quarter.
