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#### A. Explanatory Notes Pursuant to Malaysian Financial Reporting Standard ("MFRS") No. 134

#### **A1.** BASIS OF PREPARATION

The interim financial report is unaudited and has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 9, Continuing Disclosure, Paragraph 9.22 of the Main Market Listing Requirements ("LR") of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad ("Bursa Securities") and in compliance with Malaysian Financial Reporting Standards ("MFRSs") 134, Interim Financial Reporting issued by Malaysian Accounting Standards Board (MASB), and should be read in conjunction with the Group's annual audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2011.

The explanatory notes attached to these interim financial report provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the year ended 31 December 2011.

The Group recorded profit before taxation ("PBT") of RM1.35 million in the quarter under review ("Q2 2012") as compared to PBT of RM0.24 million in the preceding year corresponding quarter ("Q2 2011").

The Malaysia and Singapore segment recorded revenue of RM53.354 million and PBT of RM0.65 million for current quarter ended 30 June 2012 ("Q2 2012") as compared to revenue of RM51.853 million and loss before taxation ("LBT") of RM0.05 million for preceding year corresponding quarter ("Q2 2011"). The results turned from loss to profit were mainly due to appreciation of US dollar ("USD") against Ringgit Malaysia ("RM") as compared to preceding year.

The Hong Kong and China segment recorded revenue of RM9.72 million and LBT RM9 thousand for Q2 2012 as compared to revenue of RM9.02 million and PBT of RM0.15 million for Q2 2011.

#### **B2.** COMPARISON WITH PRECEDING QUARTER'S RESULTS

The Group recorded revenue of RM34.11 million in the current quarter ("Q2 2012") as compared to RM28.51 million in the previous quarter ("Q1 2012"), an increase of RM5.60 million or 19.6%. The Group also recorded a profit before taxation ("PBT") of RM1.35 million for the quarter under review, as compared to previous quarter ("Q1 2012") PBT of RM1.16 million, an increase of RM0.19 million.

The increase in revenue and profit were mainly due to the improvement in demand as part of normalization trend in the HDD sector coupled with more stable foreign exchange rate.

#### **B3.** COMMENTARY ON PROSPECTS

As HDD customers have taken measures to normalise their production capacity, the Group expects its sales performance to be flat in the second half of year 2012.

Nevertheless, the Group expects its Non-HDD sales performance to improve marginally and the Group will continue to evaluate all options with its diversification programs to enhance its performance.
