(A) EXPLANATORY NOTES TO THE INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORT

1. Basis of Preparation

The interim financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The unaudited interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with FRS 134: Interim Financial Reporting and paragraph 9.22 of the Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad ("Bursa Securities").

The interim financial statements should be read in conjunction with the Annual Financial Report for the financial year ended 31 October 2011 and the accompanying explanatory notes. These notes provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant for an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the year ended 31 October 2011.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

The accounting policies and methods of computation adopted for the interim financial statements are consistent with those of the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 October 2011 except for the mandatory adoption of the following Financial Reporting Standards ("FRSs"), Amendments to FRSs and Interpretations that are effective for the financial periods beginning on or after 1 November 2011:

The application of the above FRSs, Amendments to FRSs and Interpretations did not result in any significant changes in the accounting policies and presentation of the financial results of the Group.

3. Malaysian Financial Reporting Standards

On 19 November 2011, the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board ("MASB") issued a new MASB approved accounting framework, the Malaysian Financial Reporting Standards ("MFRS Framework").

The MFRS Framework is to be applied by all Entities Other Than Private Entities for annual periods beginning on or after 1 January 2012, with the exception of entities that are within the scope of MFRS 141 Agriculture (MFRS 141) and IC Interpretation 15 Agreements for Construction of Real Estate (IC 15), including its parent, significant investor and venturer.

The Group will be required to prepare financial statements using the MFRS Framework in its first MFRS financial statements for the year ending 31 October 2013. In presenting its first MFRS financial statements, the Group may be required to restate the comparative financial statements to amounts reflecting the application of MFRS Framework. The majority of the adjustments (if any) required on transition will be made, retrospectively, against opening retained earnings.

The Group has not completed its assessment of the financial effects of the differences between Financial Reporting Standards and accounting standards under the MFRS Framework. Accordingly, the consolidated financial performance and financial position as disclosed in these financial statements for the period ended 30 April 2012 could be different if prepared under the MFRS Framework.

Nevertheless, the Group expects that there will not be any significant impact arising from the adoption of the MFRS Framework and that it will be in a position to fully comply with the requirements thereon for the financial year ending 31 October 2013.

4. Seasonal or Cyclical Factors

The Group recognises tuition fee income based on the number of teaching periods over the entire duration of the respective courses. The revenue and profit for first and third quarter of each financial year are usually lower due to summer period for courses from institutions in United Kingdom/United States and Australia.

5. Unusual Significant Items

There were no unusual items affecting assets, liabilities, equity, net income or cash flows during the current financial year-to-date.

6. Changes in Estimates

There were no changes in estimates of amounts reported in prior interim periods of the current financial year or changes in estimates of amounts reported in the prior financial year that had a material effect in the current quarter and year-to-date results.

7. Changes in Debt and Equity Securities

There were no issuances, cancellations, repurchases, resale and repayments of debt and equity securities during the current financial year-to-date.

8. Dividends Paid

There were no dividends paid during the current financial year-to-date.

9. Segmental Reporting

The Group is principally involved in education activities carried out in Malaysia and accordingly no segment reporting has been prepared.

10. Material Subsequent Events

There were no material events subsequent to the end of the current quarter.

11. Changes in the Composition of the Group

There were no changes in the composition of the Group during the current financial year-to-date.

12. Changes in Contingent Liabilities or Contingent Assets

A Writ of Summons was filed by Mr Roland Ramesh A/L Sandana Dass (trading as Seven Days Projects Solutions) ("7Days") and served on the Company's subsidiary, HELP University Sdn Bhd (formerly known as HELP University College Sdn Bhd) ("HU") for alleged default in payment of RM612,067 together with interest and costs to 7Days as a project contractor.

The Group is disputing the claims and intends to vigorously defend itself against the action.

However, as the outcome of these claims cannot be determined at this time, the Group has made no provision for these contingencies in the financial statements.

For the second quarter under review, the Group's revenue grew by 11% to RM34.7 million from RM31.4 million last year. Profit before taxation increased to RM10.5 million from RM10.2 million last year.

The growth in revenue and profit before tax were largely due to increase in student enrollment into the various campuses in Damansara and Fraser.

For the period ended 30 April 2012, the Group's revenue and profit before taxation were RM61.6 million and RM13.7 million as compared to revenue of RM55.7 million and profit before taxation of RM14.3 million respectively last year.

Profit before tax decreased marginally by 4% due to higher personnel costs and depreciation on campus facilities. The Group also incurred higher marketing costs to strengthen our presence following the upgrading of university status and the relocation of new campus in Fraser.

The Group recorded a profit before taxation of RM10.5 million for this quarter as compared to RM3.2 million recorded in the immediate preceding quarter in line with the seasonal fluctuations of the industry.

3. Commentary on Prospects

The education industry continues to be robust both domestically and internationally. In January 2012, HELP was awarded an approval by the Ministry of Education to establish an international school. The new school will be located at HELP's campus in Subang 2. HELP is optimistic that the new school will have a positive impact on the Group from 2013 onwards.

The upgrade to university status had a positive impact on student enrollment. The strong intakes have enabled the Group to register higher revenues for the period and will have a positive domino effect for the Group's prospects going into the subsequent intakes.

The Group will commence the construction of its flagship Subang 2 campus in this financial year and expects the construction to be completed in two years. Upon the completion, the Group will be able to double its current student capacity.

The current economic uncertainties have not dampened the growing demand for education in the international market especially in ASEAN. The Group continues to be a leading provider of quality education in Vietnam, Indonesia and Nepal. The Group continues to undergo active business development in ASEAN and selective countries in Asia.

The international market is growing and we remain a leading educational institution in Vietnam. The Group continues to undergo active business development in ASEAN and selective countries in Asia.

The Directors expect the financial performance of the Group to be satisfactory for the financial year 2012. The Directors remain confident that the Group is fundamentally strong and the initiatives taken during the past periods will prepare us to position HELP as a Global Education provider of quality education.

As disclosed in Paragraph 12 of Part A, on 7 May 2012, a Writ of Summons was served on HU for an alleged default in payment to 7Days as a project contractor.

HU has filed an application in Court for a stay of proceedings pending arbitration. The application is fixed for hearing on 27 June 2012.

11. Dividends

On 24 April 2012, the shareholders approved a final dividend in respect of the financial year ended 31 October 2011, of 4% less 25% taxation on 142,041,600 ordinary shares of RM0.50 each, amounting to a dividend payable of RM2,130,624 (1.5 sen net per ordinary share). The Company paid the dividend on 23 May 2012.

The Board of Directors does not recommend any dividend for the period ended 30 April 2012.
