# 13 REVIEW OF PERFORMANCE

For the period ended 30 September 2004, the Group's revenue increased marginally by 2% from RM68.3 million to RM69.9 million as compared to the corresponding period in the preceding year. This was mainly due to improved distribution and launch of new products. Inspite of the improved revenue and lower finance cost, the Group's loss before tax for the period ended 30 September 2004 maintained at RM2.7 million. This was mainly due to higher raw material cost and fuel price coupled with fierce price competition which resulted in an increase in operating expenses.

However the Group's loss before tax for the 3rd quarter ended 30 September 2004 decreased from RM0.6million to RM0.5million as compared to the corresponding quarter in the preceding year. This was resulted from lower finance cost.

## 14 VARIATIONS OF RESULTS AGAINST PRECEDING QUARTER

The Group's revenue for the quarter ended 30 September 2004 increased by 2% to RM24.2 million as compared to RM23.6 million in the preceding quarter. This was mainly due to the launching of new products in the 3rd quarter.

Due to improved revenue and lower finance cost, the Group's loss before tax for the quarter improved from RM1.1m to RM0.5m as compared to the preceding quarter.

## 15 CURRENT YEAR PROSPECT

With the uncertainty of raw material cost and fuel price and re-pegging of USD currency, margin will continue to come under pressure. The Group will make extra efforts to counter these adversities continuously. Barring unforeseen circumstances, the Board expects the Group's operating performance for year 2004 to recover at a satisfactory level.

### 16 **PROFIT FORECAST**

The Company does not have any comparable profit forecast in respect of actual profit.

### 17 TAXATION

For the current quarter and the cumulative quarter ended 30 September 2004, there is no tax liability for the Group as it has no chargeable income.

## 18 PROFIT ON SALES OF INVESTMENTS AND OR PROPERTIES

There were no sales of investments and/or properties for the cumulative quarter ended 30 September 2004.

## 19 PURCHASE OR DISPOSAL OF QUOTED SECURITIES

There were no investment in quoted shares for the quarter or cumulative quarter to date.

## 20 CORPORATE PROPOSALS

The following proposals have been approved and adopted by the Shareholders of the Company at the Extraordinary General Meeting held on 16 February 2004:-

- a) Renounceable two-call rights issue with free detachable warrants on the basis of four (4) rights shares together with three(3) warrants for every two (2) existing ordinary shares held (Rights Issue with Warrants).
- b) Employee Share Option Scheme (ESOS).

The Abridged Prospectus in relation to the Rights Issue with Warrants were despatched to the Shareholders on 29 April 2004 and the last acceptance and payment for the Rights Issue was on 27 May 2004.

The ESOS was implemented on 6 May 2004 and the proceeds raised was utilised as Working Capital.

The Rights Issue with Warrants had been successfully completed on 16 June 2004.

The proceeds arising from the Rights Issue with Warrants has been utilised for the following:

On 30 July 2004, the Company announced its proposal to expand the eligibility criteria of the ESOS to include non-executive Directors and to increase maximum number of new shares that may be allotted pursuant to the ESOS to be not more than 15% of the issued and paid up share capital (Presently:10%) which would require amendments to the Articles of Association of the Company and Bye-Laws of the existing ESOS (Proposed Amendments).

Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad had on 8 October 2004, granted its approval-in-principle for the listing of such number of new ordinary shares to be issued pursuant to the exercise of options granted under the ESOS of up to 15% the issued and paid-up share capital.

The Proposed Amendments are now subject to the approval of the Shareholders of the Company at an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held on 13 December 2004.
