Part A - Explanatory Notes Pursuant to MFRS 134

1 Basis of Preparation

The unaudited interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with MFRS 134: Interim Financial Reporting issued by the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board ("MASB") and Chapter 9, Part K of the Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad ("Bursa Securities").

The interim financial statements should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements for the financial year ended 31 March 2019. The explanatory notes attached to the interim financial statements provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the financial year ended 31 March 2019.

2 Significant Accounting Policies

The significant accounting policies and computation methods are consistent with those of the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2019, except for the adoption of the following Amendments to MFRSes during the current financial period:

MFRS 16 Leases

MFRS 16, which upon the effective date will supersede MFRS 117 Leases, introduces a single lessee accounting model and requires a lessee to recognise assets and liabilities for all leases with a term of more than 12 months, unless the underlying asset is of low value. Specifically, under MFRS 16, a lessee is required to recognise a right-of-use asset representing its right to use the underlying leased asset and a lease liability representing its obligation to make lease payments. Accordingly, a lessee should recognise depreciation of the right-of-use asset and interest on the lease liability, and also classifies cash repayments of the lease liability into a principal portion and an interest portion and presents them in the statement of cash flows. Also, the right-of-use asset and the lease liability are initially measured on a present value basis. The measurement includes non-cancellable lease payments and also includes payments to be made in optional periods if the lessee is reasonably certain to exercise an option to extend the lease, or not to exercise an option to terminate the lease. This accounting treatment is significantly different from the lessee accounting for leases that are classified as operating leases under the predecessor standard, MFRS 117.

In respect of the lessor accounting, MFRS 16 substantially carries forward the lessor accounting requirements in MFRS 117. Accordingly, a lessor continues to classify its leases as operating leases or finance leases, and to account for those two types of leases differently.

Based on the assessment, the Group and the Company do not expect the application of MFRS 16 to have a significant impact on its consolidated fi nancial statements.

3 Auditors' Report

The auditors' report on the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2019 was not subject to any qualification.

4 Seasonality or Cyclical Factors

There were no material factors of a seasonal or cyclical nature which affected the operations of the Group during the current financial quarter and financial year-to-date.

13 Changes in Group Composition

On 5th October 2018, the Group ("JKB") via its subsidiary, Jasa Kita Trading Sdn Bhd ("JKT") has completed the acquisition of the remaining 49,000 ordinary shares of Jasahalco (INT.) Sdn Bhd ("JHI"), representing the remaining 49% of the equity interest in JHI for a total cash consideration of RM49,000. Following the acquisition, JHI has become a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Group.

16 Review of Performance

Quarter 1, FYE 2020 vs Quarter 1, FYE 2019 and Year-to-date 30 June 2019 vs Year-to-date 30 June 2018

For the quarter under review, group's turnover increased 20.6% from RM7.29 million to RM8.79 million and gross profit increased by 23.2% from RM1.88 million to RM2.32 million

Distribution and trading

Turnover increased 24.6% from RM6.37 million to RM7.93 million and losses before tax decreased by 74.6% from RM1.34 million to RM339,000. The increase in turnover and lower losses are largely attributable to higher sales and profit margin from automotive batteries and its related products and sales of electric motors.

Logistics related services

Turnover decreased by 16.9% from RM806,000 to RM670,000. The decline in turnover had resulted in lower profit before tax of RM56,000 as compared to RM109,000 for corresponding quarter in preceding year. The decline in performance is due to lower importation for certain customers.

17 Current Quarter vs Preceding Quarter Results

Group's turnover was marginally higher at RM8.80 million for the current quarter as compared to RM8.73 million for the preceding quarter. Losses before tax was significantly lower at RM293,000 as compared to RM7.74 million for the preceding quarter. Turnover have marginally increased across all product segments in the current quarter while the higher losses in the preceding quarter were ascribed to inventories written down amounting to RM5.8 million and other write off (PPE, bad debts and deposit) amounting to RM875,000.

18 Commentary on Prospects

The Group have completed the cost and operational rationalisation programmes and is currently working on strategies to streamline and grow its automotive batteries and its related products business into one of the group's main income stream and reenergised its other divisions' sales and financial peformance. Sales of all divisions' products continued to be challenging due to saturated market, fierce competition and challenging global and local economies.

19 Profit Forecast and Guarantee

The Group has not provided any profit forecast or profit guarantee in any public document.
