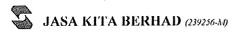

### Part A - Explanatory Notes Pursuant to MFRS 134

### 1 Basis of Preparation

The unaudited interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with MFRS 134: Interim Financial Reporting issued by the Malaysian Accounting Standards Board ("MASB") and Chapter 9, Part K of the Listing Requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities Berhad ("Bursa Securities").

The interim financial statements should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements for the financial year ended 31 March 2019. The explanatory notes attached to the interim financial statements provide an explanation of events and transactions that are significant to an understanding of the changes in the financial position and performance of the Group since the financial year ended 31 March 2019.

### 2 Significant Accounting Policies

The significant accounting policies and computation methods are consistent with those of the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2019, except for the adoption of the following Amendments to MFRSes during the current financial period:

The initial application of the abovementioned accounting standards, amendments or interpretations are not expected to have any material impact to the financial statements of the Group and of the Company except as mentioned below:



### MFRS 16 Leases

MFRS 16, which upon the effective date will supersede MFRS 117 Leases, introduces a single lessee accounting model and requires a lessee to recognise assets and liabilities for all leases with a term of more than 12 months, unless the underlying asset is of low value. Specifically, under MFRS 16, a lessee is required to recognise a right-of-use asset representing its right to use the underlying leased asset and a lease liability representing its obligation to make lease payments. Accordingly, a lessee should recognise depreciation of the right-of-use asset and interest on the lease liability, and also classifies cash repayments of the lease liability into a principal portion and an interest portion and presents them in the statement of cash flows. Also, the right-of-use asset and the lease liability are initially measured on a present value basis. The measurement includes non-cancellable lease payments and also includes payments to be made in optional periods if the lessee is reasonably certain to exercise an option to extend the lease, or not to exercise an option to terminate the lease. This accounting treatment is significantly different from the lessee accounting for leases that are classified as operating leases under the predecessor standard, MFRS 117.

In respect of the lessor accounting, MFRS 16 substantially carries forward the lessor accounting requirements in MFRS 117. Accordingly, a lessor continues to classify its leases as operating leases or finance leases, and to account for those two types of leases differently.

Based on the assessment, the Group and the Company do not expect the application of MFRS 16 to have a significant impact on its consolidated fi nancial statements.

### 3 Auditors' Report

The auditors' report on the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2019 was not subject to any qualification.

### 4 Seasonality or Cyclical Factors

There were no material factors of a seasonal or cyclical nature which affected the operations of the Group during the current financial quarter and financial year-to-date.

### 5 Unusual Items

There were no items in the current quarter affecting assets, liabilities, equity, net income, or cash flows of the Group that are unusual because of their nature, size or incidence.

### 16 Review of Performance

### Quarter 3, FYE 2020 vs Quarter 3, FYE 2019

For the quarter under review, Group's turnover declined 14.6% from RM9.28 million to RM7.93 million. Gross profit is marginally decreased by 1.7% from RM1.86 million to RM1.83 million.

### Distribution and trading

Turnover decreased 16.2% from RM8.45 million to RM7.08 million, mainly attributable to lost of sales from power tools and automotive batteries divisions. However, losses before tax was significantly lower by 66.9% to RM0.86 million as compared to RM2.58 million, which consist mainly operational rationalisation expenditure in tools division for the corresponding quarter in preceding year.

### Logistics related services

Turnover marginally increased by 1.4% from RM717,000 to RM727,000. Losses before tax increased to RM166,000 as compared to RM7,000 for the corresponding quarter in preceding year, mainly due to higher rental expenses.

# Year-to-date 31 December 2019 vs Year-to-date 31 December 2018

Group's turnover decreased 4.1% from RM25.9 million for the previous year to RM24.9 million for the current year mainly attributable to decreased contribution from power tools and hand tools divisions. However, losses before tax was lower by 43.9% from RM4.03 million to RM2.26 million, resulted from saving in operational rationalisation in tools division for the previous year.

### Distribution and trading

Turnover was lower by 5.0% from RM23.3 million to RM22.2 million. Losses before tax is lower by 41.1% from RM4.9 million to RM2.9 million year to date. Operating expenses is lower resulted from operational cost rationalisation in tools division for the previous year.

### Logistics related services

Turnover marginally reduced by 1.5% from RM2.18 million to RM2.15 million for the reporting period. Profit before tax of RM67,000 was wipe out to RM128,000 loss before tax due to increased in rental expenses.

### 17 Current Quarter vs Preceding Quarter Results

Group's turnover was slightly lower by 1.9% to RM7.93 million for the current quarter as compared to RM8.08 million for the preceding quarter. However, losses before tax was reduced by 41.2% to RM0.84 million as compared to RM1.43 million for the preceding quarter. Turnover decreased mainly from automotive batteries division and power tools division in the current quarter. Lower losses in the current quarter under review were mainly due to business reorganisation of automotive batteries division in the preceding quarter, ie. Property, Plant and Equipment written down from closing non-profitable GP outlets and impairment of trade receivables.

### 18 Commentary on Prospects

Sales performance of the Group's business divisions continue to be challenging. However, in view of the relaunching of major infrastructure projects in the country, we expect sales for power tools and electric motors to improve.

Following an extensive review conducted on the viability of the GPO outlets business model for the automotive batteries division, the Group has deduced that the operation of the GPO outlets, in the present market condition and without the economy of scale, is not profitable and had thus decided to suspend the automotive batteries trading business. Moving forward, the Management will be focusing on enhancing its existing industrial tools segment, as well as on the marketing and distribution of the newly acquired sanitary ware business.
