#### A1 Basis of Preparation

The interim financial statements are unaudited and have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of Financial Reporting Standards (FRS) 134 "Interim Financial Reporting" issued by the Malaysian Accounting Standard Board (MASB) and Parahraph 9.22 of the Main Market Listing requirements.

The Transitioning Entities are given an option to defer adoption of the MFRSs Framework for an additional one year. Transitioning Entities also includes those entities that consolidate or equity account or proportionately consolidate another entity that has chosen to continue to apply the FRSs framework for annual periods beginning on or after 1st January 2012.

The Group falls within the scope of definition of Transitioning Entities and have chosen to defer the adoption of the MFRSs Framework for an additional one year. Accordingly, the Group will prepare its first MFRSs financial statements using the MFRSs Framework for the financial year ending 31st December 2013. In presenting its first MFRS financial statements, the Group will be required to restate the comparative financial statements to amounts reflecting the application of MFRS Framework. The majority of the adjustments required on transition will be made, retrospectively, against opening retained profits.

The Group is currently assessing financial effects of the differences between Financial Reporting Standards and accounting standards under the MFRSs Framework. The Group expects to be in a position to fully comply with the requirements of the MFRSs Framework for the financial year ending 31 December 2013.

### A3 Seasonality or Cyclicality of Operations

The business operations of the Group are not materially affected by the seasonal or cyclical factors.

#### A4 Unusual Items

There were no unusual items affecting the assets, liabilities, equity, net income or cash flow during the financial period under review.

### A5 Material Changes in Estimates

There was no change in estimates that have any material effect on the financial year-to-date.

#### A6 Debt and Equity Securities

On 7 June 2012, the shareholders of the Company at the Nineteenth Annual General Meeting, approved the renewal of authority for the Company to purchase its own shares. In the quarter under review, the company did not purchase any of its issued shares capital from the open market. The total number of shares held as treasury shares as at 30 September 2012 was 2,978,046 at a total cost of RM813,410.60. The repurchased shares are being held as treasury shares in accordance with the provision of Section 67A of the Companies Act,1965.

#### A7 Dividend Paid

In this current quarter, the Company paid a first and final single tier dividend of 10% per share on 4 September 2012 in respect of financial year ended 31 December 2011.

#### B1 Review of the Performance

For the third quarter ended 30 September 2012, the Group achieved revenue of RM74.5 million which was 27.7% higher than the previous year's corresponding quarter. The increase in revenue was mainly derived from the construction and property development divisions. With higher material cost and project overhead cost, the operating expenses for the quarter under review were 69.8% higher than the previous year's corresponding quarter. Consequently, the Group achieved lower profit before tax of RM5.6 million as compared to RM17.7 million in the third quarter of 2011. For the 9 months ended 30 September 2012, the Group's revenue reduced by RM37.0 million (18.6%) to RM161.5 million from RM198.4 million in the 9 months of 2011. Correspondingly, the Group reported a lower profit before tax of RM14.1 million for the period under review as compared to RM43.5 million reported in the corresponding period of last year.

Construction division recorded lower revenue and profit before tax of RM100.3 million and RM6.6 million respectively in the 9 months of 2012 as compared to RM105.3 million and RM22.3 million achieved in the 9 months of 2011. As the construction activities only started picking up in the third quarter of 2012, the revenue has reduced slightly by 4.7%. The profits has reduced significantly by 70.5% compared to cumulative quarter ended 30 September 2011. The reduction in profits was mainly due to increase in material cost and project overhead cost from the current on-going projects.

The Property development division contributed lower revenue and profit before tax of RM44.1 million and RM7.3 million in the 9 months ended 30 September 2012 as compared to RM74.7 million and RM20.8 million achieved in the corresponding period in 2011. The drop was attributed by the regulations to curb investments in the high end property market and its escalating effect on other property segment.

The manufacturing division's performance was about the same as previous year following low construction activities that affected the demand of quarry products.

For the healthcare division, eventhough the revenue reported was lower by 5.9% from RM14.7 million to RM13.9 million, the losses recognised by the healthcare division has doubled from RM0.5 million to RM1.0 million in the period under review. The increase in operating expenses and finance cost for purchase of operation equipment and renovation cost for Penang Eye Hospital were the main cause.

For this current quarter under review, the Group recorded a revenue and profit before tax of RM74.5 million and RM5.6 million, representing an increase of 39.2% and 22.1% respectively compared to the immediate preceding quarter.

The increase in both revenue & PBT was mainly derived from construction and property development divisions. The construction activities of newly awarded projects has since picked up. Sales of 2 parcels of petrol land in Taman Puchong Prima has also contributed significantly to the Group's profits.

#### **B4** Current Year Prospects

The outstanding order book for construction division currently stands at RM564.1 million and will be recognised progressively till 2014. Profit contributions from some of these on-going projects will nonetheless be affected by the increasing material cost and operating expenses.

The performance of the Group's local property division for the final quarter of 2012 is highly dependent on sales of completed shop offices in Puchong. The take up rate of these shop offices has picked up with the news of the location of the proposed LRT station in Taman Puchong Prima. Some profit recognition from sales of the recently launched Duplex project in Puchong would be achieved but may not be sufficient to set-off against losses from the low cost project in Puchong. The Group can nonetheless expect to have some profit contribution from our property project in South Africa upon completion of the process of transfer by end of this year.

In view of the current high competitive environment in Lasik eye treatment business, our healthcare division has undertaken aggressive marketing strategies to boost sales as well as internal restructuring to improve cost efficiency. The management has taken step to close down some non-performing branches and it has resulted in lower operating expenses. The Board is hopeful that the healthcare division will be able to improve its performance in the final quarter of the year.

#### **B9** Pending Material Litigation

On 4 January 2006, the Company, the Company's wholly owned subsidiary, Dutawani Sdn Bhd ("Dutawani") and its Managing Director, Tan Eng Piow were served with a writ and statement of claim by Pandan Perkasa Sdn Bhd ("PPSB"), for the alleged breach of a Joint venture Agreement and a Suplemental Agreement between PPSB and Dutawani. The Company's solicitors were of the opinion that PPSB had no case against the Company.

Upon completion of the proceedings of the High Court, the High Court upheld our Coursel's submission of no case to answer and the Court dismissed PPSB's claim with costs on 23 December 2010. As regards Dutawani's counterclaim against PPSB, the High Court awarded judgment in the sum of RM250,000.00 against PPSB with interest thereon at 8% per annum from 23 December 2010 until the date of full settlement and costs.

The application of PPSB's appeal against the decision of the High Court was successful and PPSB has filed in their Record of Appeal in the Court of Appeal. The Court of Appeal has fixed the case management for the appeal on 11 December 2012.
